

# Playground News

We are thrilled to announce the arrival of the new and exciting rope climber! Over the past week, all students have been instructed by Mr. Wittenberg as to "safe play" on the climber during gym class. Please note that the rope climber has been recommended for ages 5+, therefore, our kindergarten children will not be trained on the climber at this time.

Over the next few weeks, we will be opening the climber to grades 1-6, one class at a time during each recess before we determine how we will add it to the current playground schedule. I also wanted to also inform you that the older big wooden climber is currently closed due to some necessary safety improvements. We will let you know as soon as these fixes are complete.



#### Yard Duty 3:20-3:35pm

This is a reminder that from 3:20 -3:35pm, there is one teacher supervising the schoolyard. It is important to note that this teacher's responsibility is to make sure that all students are either picked up or have left for the school day safely.

If, at 3:35pm, a primary student (gr. 1-3) is not picked up, a teacher will bring the student(s) to the office to make arrangements for pick up. We ask that during this period of time (3:20-3:35pm), if your child wishes to use the playground equipment that they are supervised by a parent/guardian. It is not possible for the teacher to supervise students on the playground equipment as well as being present and available in the yard.

As well, **please note that the rope climber is for children age 5+ and therefore we do not recommend it's use for kindergarten students.** After 3:35pm, there is no teacher on supervision duty and it is the responsibility of parents/guardians to supervise their own children.





Whitney School has a long tradition of giving back. One of the ways in which students have participated in outreach is through a community service assignment.Students in grades four, five and six participate in this assignment usually every other year. Here is the assignment the students have been asked to complete:

#### **Community Service Assignment**

Due: End Of January 2015

In some of our classes, we have been discussing and writing about people who have made a difference in the lives of others. In current events, some of us have read about Malala and how she spoke out in favour of education for girls in her country of Pakistan. On Remembrance day, we thought about soldiers and others who were heroes in times of war. No matter how young or old we are, we can make a difference in the world simply by taking small steps. Considering that this time of year is about giving, you are expected to take a small step to make a difference in the lives of those around you and/or in your community by doing some form of community service.

Examples:

- Shovel snow for an elderly person living in your community.
- Donate gently used to a holiday food drive.
- Donate non-perishable food to a shelter.

You may choose to do this community service on your own, with your family, with a friend or as a small group of friends. <u>Remember: this is about</u> <u>YOU making a difference in the world around</u> <u>you.</u> Once you have completed your Community Service, complete a reflection on your experience and if appropriate, include pictures of your work.

#### **Community Service Reflection**

On a separate sheet, write or type detailed answers to the questions/prompts about the community service activity that you completed.

At the top of your paper write or type the following:

- The community service activity you performed
- The date you participated
- The place the community service occurred
- The people/organization involved with the community service
- 1. Describe the community service that you provided in and your specific responsibilities and accomplishments.
- 2. Carefully describe your initial feelings before you started the activity and then explain how you felt afterwards.
- 3. Describe what you feel you gained from this experience.
- 4. What did you learn about yourself and your relationship with the community.
- 5. Would you volunteer again? Why or why not?

#### Dancing Around the World

This year, in order to enhance our dance program as well as expose our students to different cultures and traditions, Whitney P.S. will be "dancing around the world"! beginning with the fantastic production of **Bboyizm** on November 27th which focused on



the evolution of dance, rap, hip hop from the 1970's to present day! It was a highly interactive performance that had both teachers and students alike showcasing their cool new dance steps!

In January 2015, we will welcome dancers from the Shiamak Dance Theatre for a week of Bollywood Style Dancing! Students will receive dance training, knowledge of fundamentals and styles and techniques.

All of the students in grades four to six will once again have their knowledge of the classical ballet world extended through participation in the **YOUdance** program offered through a partnership with the National Ballet School of Canada and the TDSB. Students will receive an hour long lesson with a dance educator from the Ballet School in the gym. In February, they will attend a performance of the Ballet School professional students at the Betty Oliphant Theatre in February.

In April 2015, we welcome Tribal Vision Dance, a dance troupe from the Six Nations of the Grand River Territory. Stereotypes are to be met head on in this high energy dancing and singing performance offering an engaging look at First Nations culture. This particular dance entitled 'Visions of Turtle Island' is also a multi media performance Our grade three students will further participate with their teachers in a special workshop where they will learn more about First Nations music and pick up some of the basic steps and moves involved in hoop dancing. Prologue continues to be a wonderful partner with the TDSB!


