Children who will be four years old by December 31, 2015 (born in 2011) may enter Junior Kindergarten this September 2015.


Registration will occur between February 2nd and February 13th.






How to be a Fashionista - Create one of a kind design, develop your style, and experiment with different materials without mastering the sewing machine. This course allows the students the
