Special mention goes to the **winner of the Consolation Round: The Neon Ninjas** - Keeley, Livie, Sara and Lilah.



Gifted Assessment

Each year in the TDSB, we offer a gifted scanning for those students who have demonstrated skills in the classroom at a gifted level. **Although potentially gifted students in any grade can be considered in this process, the main focus at this time will be on students entering grade 3 or grade 6 in September 2015 who wish to access the gifted programs in Grade 4 or grade 7.**

Classroom teachers and parents can recommend students as possible candidates for this gifted assessment. Parents and teachers would then be asked to complete checklists to assist in creating a profile of the student and all information about a student will be presented at a School Support Team (SST) meeting in late September/early October 2015 to which parents are invited. The SST will consider all requests and make the final decision based on the student's needs.

The focus is on students who wish to access an intensive support programs (ISP) the following year with emphasis on students in Grade 3 moving to grade 4 and students in grade 6 moving to grade 7. As there are no gifted intensive support classes at Whitney P.S., students who meet the criteria would be offered a placement in a school closest to their home. With parent permission, candidates recommended by the SST will then go forward for psychological assessments during the month of November 2015.

You may also choose to have your child assessed privately (at your own expense). The TDSB will consider results of a private assessment when conducted by a registered psychologist or psychological associate. Parents can call the Ontario Psychological Association Referral service ([416-961-0069](tel:416-961-0069)) if you require further details as to cost, etc.

If you are currently the parent of a child in grade 2 or grade 5 AND have interest, please speak to your child's teacher for more information and/or to submit your child's name for consideration.
