SCOOTERS, SKATEBOARDS, LONG BOARDS and BIKES

This is a very important reminder for all students who bring their scooters, skateboards, long boards and bikes to school. Scooters, skateboards, long boards and bikes may be used to **get** to school, but are **NOT** to be used on school property.



Students must walk their bikes onto school property and lock them up by the bike racks. Also, scooters, skateboards and long boards must be left outside under the overhang outside the main doors and not used between the hours of 8:30 and 3:45. Thank you in advance for your cooperation



As the warmer weather approaches (we hope), we want to remind students and parents of appropriate dress at school. Although there is no particular dress code required, there are a few simple rules to ensure a safe, inclusive and respectful atmosphere.

- Running shoes and comfortable shorts are required for gym class.
- Hats may not be worn indoors except for religious or cultural headwear.
- Messages and images on t-shirts must be appropriate for school. Please keep the messages POSITIVE!
- Midriffs and tummies should be covered and straps on tops must be at least two finger widths across with no bra straps visible.
- Very short shorts are not appropriate for school; please ensure that underwear is not visible.

In addition to the playground improvements completed last Fall – the orange/green net climber (top of hill), basketball standards (east side of playground), baseball backstop and planting garden in the Kinder playground – a series of new upgrades will take place this spring, thanks to the generous support of Whitney families.

- 1) The TDSB crew will be on site again to add a few new pieces of play equipment at the top of the hill (two new spinners, replacement teeter totter, repaired yellow/blue net climber) See below for pics of the new items. Once these are installed, the crew will complete the playing field (remove limestone, irrigate, lay down sod).
- (2) Working with the Kinder teachers, we purchased several sturdy, heavy-use outdoor play items. This includes 10 trikes (small, medium and a taxi version), traffic signs and lights, an outdoor 4-sided easel, Octoplay, kid-sized gardening tools and a gym cart.
- (3) The lovely thumb print tree recognizing all donors is in the main case across from the office. Engraving is underway on the boulder recognizing donors at the \$2500+ level.
- (4) We are still working with the TDSB on two additional items for the kinder area, namely possible removal of the concrete planters to increase the play space and installation of a storage shed.

Thanks again for the generous support of so many Whitney Families.
