2014/15 spending

A general meeting of the Whitney School Council (the "Council") has been called for Tuesday, June 16, 2015, in the Whitney Library, at which time three (3) motions will be proposed with respect to spending a portion of the excess funds the Council currently has in its bank account. Parents and teachers are invited to vote in person or to send in a vote by proxy (appended).

Current Financial Position

We are in the position of having \$22,400 of excess funds above what is required to fund the remainder of the Council's 2014/2015 operating costs.

Also, historically, the Council has started each school year with at least 100% of funding in place for the budget at hand. In the 2014/2015 school year, we raised net revenue of approximately \$61,000 and expect to generate a further \$8,000 from Pizza Lunches, for a total of \$69,000, which will fully fund the upcoming 2015/2016 school year's anticipated operating budget.

Technology

Total Cost: **\$9,000**

A. Computers and computer monitors (Estimated Cost: \$2,400). Purpose: To purchase 3 refurbished computers to replace older Dell 520 computers, upgrade 29 computers with 2gb of data (making them windows 7 compatible), and purchase 7 classroom monitors.

B. School Sound System (Estimated Cost: Up to \$3,400). Purpose: To purchase a new sound system for the gym that could replace the aging microphone and sound system. It will be used for assemblies, presentations, SPA days and school wide performances, including the Holiday Concert, Talent Show and after four drama performances. Currently, the Council rents sound system for the Holiday Concert and Talent Show at a cost of \$400 - \$500 per rental. Purchasing an updated sound system is a more cost-effective solution in the long run.

C. 10 Mini iPads and protective cases (Estimated Cost: \$3,200). Purpose: To build on our initial investment in Apple iPads, to purchase 10 min iPads for in-classroom academic support and enhancement, student documentation & assessment. These would be charged by our October 2014 investment in an iPad charging and syncing cart capable of charging up to 30 iPads/mini iPads. This investment brings our total number of iPads &mini iPads up to 26.



Furniture and Fixtures – Assembly Chairs

Total Cost: **\$2,200.**

Purpose: To purchase 100 stackable assembly chairs to replace our older and mix-matched chairs for school performances. Acquiring these chairs will benefit the school, in that we will not have to remove chairs from classrooms for any whole school performances as the new chairs will remain the gym area under the stage (cost \$22 including tax per chair)



Literacy – Leveled Readers & other literacy/social studies enhancement materials Total Cost: Up to \$3,000.

Purpose: To enhance and enrich our library of leveled primary readers as well as the social studies inquiry based curriculum.



While Whitney's involvement with Amani has always been a worthwhile cause, this year there is a special reason to fund raise as a grade five student, Nate (and his family, including Henry (gr 3) and Sadie (gr 7), will be visiting the Amani Children's Home this month during a family trip to Africa. Nate and his family will spend time at the Home where they will meet some of the kids and the staff and also give them our donation. The family has already pledged a most generous amount towards our fund raising efforts in addition to what our class raised.

Here is a comment from Nate about our party:

"Room 308 had a party for the Amani Childrens' Home. Ms. Mandel and many parents provided treats and pizza and we all brought in some money. We raised over \$1000! This amount can provide desks and chairs for one classroom at Amani. At the party we had 'a guess the number of jellybeans contest', a quiz about Africa and extended recess. Prizes were given out such as \$20 itunes card and \$5 gift cards to Scoops."

Room 308 and the Amani Children's Home

The Amani Children's Home is in Moshi, Tanzania. Amani, which means 'peace' in Swahili was founded by Tanzanians and over the past decade has rescued hundreds of children from the perils of life on the streets. Children are driven away or leave their homes for a combination of factors including poverty, abuse, neglect, and family crisis often brought about due to illnesses such as HIV/Aids. As we at Whitney can only imagine, once on the streets, children face many dangers including hunger, exploitation and often become addicted to sniffing glue and petrol. Amani provides healthy food, education, counselling and medical care for every street child who turns to help from the Amani Home. When possible, children are reunified with families.

For the past number of years, I have been involved in different ways with the Amani Children's Home. This involvement has included fund raising with my students and having a past director of the Home visit in my classroom. This year we had a party to celebrate our fund raising efforts. My students have also corresponded as pen pals with the children at the Amani Home. There is always huge excitement in the classroom when the letters and art pieces arrive at Whitney, some of them in Swahili, some translated into English by the teachers at Amani. Here are a few comments about our Amani pen pal friends by Jaqueline, Nicole and Carmen.

"When I get a letter and drawings from my friend at the Amani Children's Home, I feel happy that these children are trying so hard and taking time to write letters to us all the way from Africa."

"The children at Amani are very good artists. They send us pictures of lions, giraffes and other wild life and also Mount Kilimanjaro."

'The kids at Amani send us words in both English and Swahili and they are good teachers. I have learned that 'Jambo' means hello and 'Karibu' means welcome."
