K to 8 @ Whitney: Update

Dear Whitney Parents,

Here is an update on the potential of Whitney PS moving to K to Grade 8 School as early as September 2017.

On October 5th, Andrew Pollock and I attended a meeting with Deborah Stern (our principal), Chris Moise (our Trustee), and Mike Gallagher (our Superintendent) to discuss the plans, propose alternatives and relay questions from our community. Also in attendance were parent council members, trustee and principal from Rosedale Junior PS and Deer Park, other two schools which will be impacted by the change.

The review and potential change is driven by attendance numbers at Whitney which places the current and projected utilization rates at around 70%. Deer Park is looking at over 100% capacity 2018 onwards. The immediate pressure for the change is reduced since spring by a big drop in attendance at Deer Park this year. However, the situation is expected to get worse in the next 3 to 5



years and still needs to be addressed. Any extension in Rosedale is not an option since Rosedale is over capacity and is currently supported by portable on sight.

Meeting was informative and focused on data supporting the proposed solution. We questioned the assumptions, the results and offered alternative avenues to explore. The parents from Rosedale Junior and Deer Park were also in agreement. The alternative proposals included moving the catchment area of Whitney and review of optional attendance in both Rosedale and Deer park. The next meeting will be help on October 13th where TDSB planning committee will provide data on the alternatives solutions for discussion. The final meeting will be open to public, to be held on October 20th.

Meric Koksal, Co-Chair Whitney School Council On Monday, September 26th, we hosted the first Whitney School Council - General Council Meeting of this year. We had a great turn-out with many parents interested to learn more about the proposal of Whitney moving to a K-G8 school. The TDSB planning committee presentation included review of relative capacity at Deer Park, Rosedale Junior and Whitney Public Schools which led to the exploration of ideas for the area. The members outlined the timeline for the ongoing review and how Whitney parents can be involved in the decision process.

The Council Meeting also included a review of financials yd. and budget for the 2016/17 school year. Our operating budget is \$67,000 and has been funded from parent donations made in the 2015/2016 school year. Each year, we fundraise for the upcoming year. This enables us to plan ahead and ensure continuity of enhanced programming for Whitney students. We have four fundraising events: the Annual Giving Campaign, Harvest Fest, Pizza Lunches and the Main Event. For those new to Whitney, the Main Event is our school's social evening, fundraiser and silent auction with parents and teachers in May 2017.

At this week's meeting, we reviewed funds raised to date from the Annual Giving Campaign. We included a donation ask letter in the packages sent home the first week of school. To date, we have raised \$20,000 towards our goal of \$25,000 to \$30,000.

We also provided results for Harvest Fest held on September 29, which was a success despite the rain. Total revenue was \$6,800 and we generated just north of \$3,000 in net profit.

For your information, our meetings are minute'd and are available in the office. They are also circulated in the Whitney Word ahead of every meeting.



"When words aren't enough, we need the emotions to soar, and with such a big theme as Terry Fox's legacy, that's what we needed to do. This musical is beautiful in how it captures the essence of Terry's heart and the commitment to his cause," says Reimer. He added that Terry's family was closely involved to make sure his story was told in a way that would honour his memory.

The original van that Terry and his brother Darrell used in their drive across Canada will be on display at the theatre, and Darrell Fox will be attending the opening night show.

"We're pretty excited, we don't do a lot of world premieres," says Reimer. "We primarily do plays that we know the people will like in advance that are part of our cultural mosaic. But this is one where
