#### Whitney School Council (WSC) Communiqué

#### 2017 Spending Vote

A general meeting of the Whitney School Council (the "Council") has been called for Wednesday, February 22, 2017, in the Whitney Library, at which time two (2) motions will be proposed with respect to spending a portion of the excess funds the Council currently has in its bank account.

Parents and teachers are invited to vote in person or to send in a vote by proxy (appended).

#### **Current Financial Position**

Historically, Whitney has started each school year with at least 100% of funding in place for the budget at hand. We are in the position of having excess funds above what is required to fund the remainder of the Council's 2016/2017 operating costs and 2017/2018 operating budget.

 In addition to these funds, the Council expects to raise net revenue of over \$30.0 from the May 2017 Main Event, and \$9.0 from the 2016/2017 Pizza Lunch program. Combined, these are sufficient to fund the Council's anticipated 2017/2018 operating budget of approximately \$68.0.

Under Canada Revenue Agency rules for non-profit charitable entities, reserves are to be spent within a finite period of time (1 to 2 years). As such, past reserves have been allocated through an annual spending vote of members of the Council (parents). Uses have included capital expenses such as Equipment and Technology (Computers, iPads, Smartboards and other new technologies), furniture and fixtures (lunchroom tables, chairs, stage curtain, sheds, sports mats) and non-building improvements (materials, books). #### 1) Kindergarten Playground (Estimated Cost up to: \$4,000)

Purpose: To contribute to the revitalization of the kindergarten playground.

**Background:** The estimated cost of the approved changes to the playground is \$35,000. Whitney parents have raised \$18,000 to date since the launch of the project. Council would like parents to consider using excess funds to fill any gaps in the fundraise to assure the completion of the renovation. The \$4,000 quoted represents the monies that were left over from the Main Playground Fundraise and rolled into the overall council budget in 2016/17 school year.

#### 2) Reading/Writing Curriculum Enhancement (Cost up to: \$1,500)

Purpose: Continue to enhance Reading and Writing Curriculum at Whitney for Grades 2-6

**Background:** We have historically purchased additional reading and writing resources to enhance students learning from Grades 3 to 6. This year we have expanded this to include Grade 2. The additional grade placed us at a shortfall vs budget of \$1,500. Council would like to bridge that gap for 2016/17 school from excess funds. The budget going forward will be increased for Reading/Writing Curriculum Enhancement to reflect additional classes.

Whitney's sixth annual Battle of the Books has begun!

Battle of the Books is an enrichment book competition for students in grades 4 to 6. Each group of four students is tasked with reading the 10 nominated Silver Birch Fiction titles. Two classroom sets of these books are available for borrowing in each junior classroom, in addition to

the school library. On **Tuesday**, March 28<sup>th</sup>, the competition begins!

Many team groups have already been submitted, showing that we have some very keen readers at Whitney! In the Battle of the Books, teams compete against each other in a 'game show' format answering factual questions about the books. Each team has a bell and the first team to ring in and say a correct answer gets a point. The team with the most points in every round wins!

Our wonderful parent volunteers are busy reading the books and compiling lists of questions for each book. i.e. Q: What is the name of the ship that Jonah wakes up on in "The Incredible Space Raiders from Space!"? (A:The Fantastic Flying Squirrel).

The 'battles' generally take place in the mornings before school at 8:00 a.m. in the library, computer room and French room, and will run for approximately two weeks ending with a final 'BATTLE' assembly between the top two teams. Parents, please encourage your Grade 4/5/6 kids to participate in this year's Battle of the Books!

The battles are lots of fun and the benefits are many  $\bullet$  the momentum created by reading (up to) ten books encourages further reading  $\bullet$  it encourages 'book talk' amongst friends - imagine!  $\bullet$  it encourages deeper reading and understanding of books  $\bullet$  it gives students the opportunity to have fun with friends around books!

Interested students should tell their teachers their group members' names by **Thursday, February 16th**. If any student is interested in participating but having difficulty finding a team please inform your teachers - we will make every effort to get them on a team!
