## Student Placement 2017-2018

Classes are organized for the following year based on the staffing model for the school which was published in the April 21st edition of the Whitney Word. Once the transfer and hiring is completed, sending and receiving teachers will meet with me and we will organize classes according to several criteria: a balance of boys and girls, a balance of student's strengths and learning needs and keeping students who work well together and separating students whose working relationships are not as productive. Students with special learning needs will also be considered in the placement process.

If you, as a parent, feel that there is something about your child's strengths and needs that we don't already know about, please send an email to myself or the teacher by <u>Friday June 2<sup>nd</sup></u>. What you tell me about your child will be taken into consideration during the placement process. Requests for specific teachers or straight versus combined classes cannot be accommodated. Placement decisions will be final and parents will be notified in the end of year report card which will be sent home on Tuesday June 27. Please note: Due to the uncertainty of class organization next year, student placements are subject to September actual enrolment/ realignment.
