a. Health and safety update (lockers, windows/doors, science labs)

Lockers & Science labs: A contractors have visited to inspect the sites to move forward with repairs and replacement.

Windows/doors: Underway this week, some classrooms may need to be temporarily moved for a short period of time. Work will happen from 4:00 pm to 1:00 am, plus weekend to make sure it's least disruptive.

- **b. Programming** (school trips) Response to parents feedback from TDSB outdoor ed bookings for next year will begin in May, two teachers have volunteered to lead, Mr. Dykshoorn & Mr. Nini.
 - Day trips are still happening this year for some grades that have not been on a school trip.
 - There were some issues with the excursion permission form. It's been resolved as of this morning (March 28). Hard copies are also being sent out with students.

VP from 1 to 0.5; Special Education from 1.5 to 1; ESL from 1 to 0.5; Library funding hasn't been confirmed; EA and SNA – not confirmed.

Ms. Francis – may be returning 0.5 (e.g., AM only)

Questions raised by parents:

Are we getting less resources? [Carrie] - Yes; 0.5 going to VP

Regular class average looks like it will be 30/32 students per teacher. Gifted classes capped at 25.

Proposed classroom models include split classes. Parents' voice is huge, along with teachers' and students'; all will be consulted.

Is this change new? [May]

The cuts are due to 61M deficit across TDSB.

No funding for library and guidance counsellor.

Lost 0.5 clerical as well as 0.5 VP.

How can parents support?

Speak to the Trustee in regards to resource allocation. Reorganization in October pending student enrolments at the school.

Models A is preferred by parents to minimize split classes.

If more gifted students are placed, then extra teacher will be allocated.

2023 will have split classes. Principal/VP will be presenting these models to Superintendent on April 11.

Christine – voiced split gifted classes might be difficult for teachers and students.

Phouv/Parents [Aarthi, Christine, Kalan, Carrie, Nina] in student council voiced their preference for Model A. Any chance of getting a full time music teacher? [May]

Mr. Le – Parents community value strong music program. Current model is not ideal with 2 teachers. Zion has specialized band and string music program. Looking for proper staffing next year.

Phouv shared some feedback from Key in regards to AYJ music programs: Student interest has been down since COVID because there were no proper Band/String music class during COVID for middle school students who transition to high school. So it's imperative that Zion continues with its Band/String music program.

Mr. Le shared parents' interest and support for the music program by spending \$7,000 on instrument repairs this year. Parents are in appreciation of the repair.

Side notes not from this meeting but a phone call and email conversation from Key that should be documented.

AYJ - Music Feedback

Mr. Snodgrass - music dept. -

Drop of participation - numbers across activities - are going down

- Assuming funding for middle school getting cut
- Lack of exposure to instruments
- Impact due to covid -
- Kids in middle school didn't have access to band/strings/vocal due to the pandemic
- We need to support in middle school arts programming
- We need to take advantage of specialized spaces at ZHMS (ex. D&T, Drama, Band/Strings, etc.)
- Funding for a strong arts program is essential to the community

Parent feedback re: school programming for next year

- Strong STEM/Robotics program at ZHMS
- Greater programming coherence with AYJ math/STEM focus
- If ZHMS restarts D&T program next year can school council purchase a few 3D printers to support the program?
