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French Course Load

- □ Grades 9 and 10 Students will take 38% to 65% of their courses in French
- □ Grades 11 and 12 Students will take 15% to 35% of their courses in French

It is important to maintain exposure to the language by taking as many courses in the French language as the students can fit into their time-table. Students should complete their required courses in French in Grades 9 and 10, because some of the options in Grades 11 and 12 may not be available every year. However, students should take at least ONE extra course in French in Grades 11 and 12 even if they already have enough credits for their Bilingualism Certificate. Students' language skills may decline in Grades 11 and 12 if they are only taking one course in French.












French Speech Arts Competition
