### Grade 5/6, Room 26 - Mr. Aguiar

The students in room 26 continued to look into the tough topic of the Holocaust. Many students had no idea what it was. Others knew very little. We started with some vocabulary (Holocaust, Nazis, concentration camps, antisemitism). The class worked in small groups writing the little they knew in pencil on a mind-map. The next day they researched the 5 Ws of the Holocaust. They were given a heads-up that they would see upsetting images as they gathered information. Their research was written in marker on their mind-maps and then shared with the class. The discussions were rich and deep. To end the lesson we did a Loving Kindness practice (part of our mindfulness class). After a lot of sadness, it was the perfect way to bring calm and positive energy back into these growing minds.

# Grade 7s - Newsletter November 12, 2021

For the last couple of weeks, students in grade 7 have taken part in discussions about the Human Rights and Responsibilities and Obligations of Canadians. Students learned that one's Freedom of Speech does not take priority over someone else's Human Rights. They understand that throughout our history, and in present times, many brave women and men, including our Indigenous brothers and sisters, have been fighting for equity, equality and inclusion. Students understand that Canada is a better place because of their sacrifices. Students in grade 7 understand that with rights come responsibilities and obligations.

In Art class, students have spent some time creating and depicting a moment in time in the lives of those women and men, from different cultures ethnicities and beliefs, who have come together in turbulent times and showed great bravery and courage fighting for the rights, freedoms, and privileges that we so enjoy today.
