1. What is a food allergy?

The immune system normally protects a person from germs and disease. It helps them to fight off bacteria, viruses, and other tiny organisms that can make them sick. If someone has a food allergy, their immune system mistakenly treats something in a particular food (most often, the protein) as if it's dangerous to them. Their body reacts to the food by having an allergic reaction.

2. How does a food allergy differ from a food intolerance?

A food allergy involves the immune system and symptoms can be lifethreatening. A food intolerance is the inability to digest or absorb certain foods. For example, someone with lactose intolerance doesn't have enough of the enzyme lactase to break down the sugar (lactose) in dairy products. The symptoms of food intolerance affect the gastrointestinal tract and can cause discomfort but are generally not life-threatening.
