#### Ramadan


How is Ramadan celebrated? Ramadan is celebrated by Muslims. Muslims celebrate Ramadan by fasting. They wake up before sunrise to eat and drink. This meal is called suhur. After sunrise while the sun is out, they do not eat or drink. They will break their fast when the sun goes down for sunset. This meal is called iftar, when Muslims break their fast. During Ramadan, people who are sick and children do not need to fast, or it is not compulsory to fast. Muslims also refrain from sin/bad deeds such as lying. They donate to charity and try to become closer to their religion by reading the holy book and praying to God. ## Napachie Pootoogook Story Drawing

Class 7/8H attended a Visual Storytelling via a Napachie Pootoogook presentation. Annie Pootoogook was a Canadian Inuk artist known for her pen and coloured pencil drawings. In her art, Pootoogook often portrayed the experiences of those in her community of Kinngait (then known in English as Cape Dorset), in northern Canada. She would draw memories and events from her own life. Her drawing tells a story without any words. For example, she drew people in Cape Dorset buying things from the freezer because she remembered how expensive the food was. This week Stressbusters went on a baking adventure. They made vegan chocolate chip cookies together. Of course, not exactly together, but rather live on google meet. Why, you may ask, is because one way to relieve stress can be doing things you like and many of our Stressbusters love to bake. Here are the ingredients to make vegan cookies for 10 servings: ½ cup sugar (100 g), ¾ cup dark brown sugar (165 g), packed, 1 teaspoon salt, ½ cup refined coconut oil (120 g), melted, ¼ cup non-dairy milk (60 mL), 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, 1 ½ cups flour(185 g), ½ teaspoon baking soda, 4 oz vegan semi-sweet chocolate(115 g), chunks and 4 oz vegan dark chocolate(115 g) chunks.
