Student Code of Conduct

At Alvin Curling Public School, we recognize that each child and situation is unique and we will always strive to ensure that our school is a safe, caring and orderly environment in which to learn and work. The **Code of Conduct** at Alvin Curling Public School is based on the following balance of rights and responsibilities.

Rights	Responsibilities
Students have the right to learn.	Students have the responsibility to actively participate and be responsible learners. Some examples include: Always trying their best Being on time and ready to work Staying focused and not distracting others Completing assignments and using a planner Always returning homework to school on time
Students have the right to be respected.	Students have the responsibility to respect others (not to tease, pick on, harass or bully others) and themselves. Some examples include: Being polite and waiting your turn Using kind words Using good listening skills Being honest and telling the truth Dress in an appropriate manner
Students have the right to be safe.	Students have the responsibility to behave in a sage manner and to protect the safety of others. Some examples include: • Walking calmly; no running in the hallways • Staying in the designated areas • Playing games safely • Use internet and social media websites responsibly • Reporting dangerous situations to staff
Students have the right to privacy and security of personal space.	Students have the responsibility to respect the property and privacy of others (students, staff and community) Some examples include: No touching other people's property without permission Respecting personal boundaries Turning off cellular phones Keeping personal toys and games at home Asking before photographing/ recording someone
Students have the right to use student equipment and property.	Students have the responsibility to use the equipment and property according to all applicable rules and with care and respect. Some examples include: Cleaning up after yourself Asking before borrowing Returning materials promptly and neatly
