# **AY Jackson Secondary School Council Meeting**

### Monday, February 4, 2019

Meeting convened at 6:05 pm

#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

## 2. Student Council Report given by Principal

- 2.1 SAC is having an Eating Contest at the end of this week. There are 24 contestants and they will be eating noodles.
- 2.2 Semi-Formal tickets go on sale on-line today. Semi-Formal takes place on Thursday February 14 and is open to all grades. It will be held at Hazelton Lanes Banquet Hall from 6:00 pm 11:00 pm.

## 3. Principal's Report

- 3.1 Report Cards will go home on Thursday February 7.
- 3.2 Graduation pictures will be taken early next week (Monday February 11).
- 3.3 Computer and Math Contests will take place later this month. Please check the school calendar on the school website.
- 3.4 OSSLT day will be held on Wednesday March 27. This is a literacy test for grade 10 students and any grade 11 or 12 students who were unsuccessful.
- 3.5 Prom will be in May.
- 3.6 Graduation will be in June.
- 3.7 Staffing update:
  - 2 teachers are on maternity leave and they have been replaced by LTO's (Long Term Occasional Teachers).
  - Currently we have about 65 teachers.
  - Next year we are projected to have approximately 1080 students.
  - February is important because it's when we gather information about courses students want for next year which helps us decide on staff for September. Seniority is also a factor. For example, if many students want to take a particular course, we need to make sure we have the appropriate number of qualified teachers to teach it.
  - Students will select courses by the end of February using My Blueprint.
  - After March Break, the board will notify us about our staffing numbers.
- 3.8 At the end of June, students will receive a tentative schedule. Lots of changes can occur over the summer because many students take summer school.
- 3.9 Classroom caps:
  - We are allowed to be 10% over the cap on 10% of courses.
  - There are different caps for different courses. For example, senior courses have a maximum cap of 30, applied classes have a cap of 23, junior courses have a cap of 31, college level courses have a cap of 28, ESL have a cap of 20, special education have a cap of 16, gifted classes have a cap of about 20.

- 3.10 Marks:
  - 54% of student marks were over 80%
  - 6.5% of student marks were unsuccessful (less than 50%)
- 3.11 Appraisals:
  - New teachers have 2 appraisals in their first year of teaching.
  - Experienced teachers get 1 appraisal every 5 years.
- 3.12 School Facilities Update:
  - Snow melted and we have many potholes. It's on the list to get repaired.
  - Monthly audits inspect ceiling tiles, extension cords
  - Mr. Paputsis meets every week with the caretaker
- 3.13 AYJ 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary next year in April.
  - Pub night
  - Grade rooms
