Tutoring Info

The TDSB is continuing to support students with unfinished learning. Through the Ministry's funding for Tutoring programs, they are pleased to announce that TDSB students will now have access to free,

unlimited, online tutoring, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We will be working with Paper and Brainfuse. These two particular organizations were chosen as they could immediately serve the needs of a school board our size, while ensuring students could access the tutoring resources at any time of day.

In addition to the extra assistance teachers already offer students, the TDSB continues to support school-based tutoring by interested TDSB teachers funded by the Ministry of Education. Parents can speak with the AYJ Admin Team about joining already existing after-school Continuing Education tutoring programs currently running at AYJ.

All tutoring services are voluntary. There is no obligation for any student to participate in tutoring. TDSB is not operating online tutoring services. This means that TDSB staff will not be present during tutoring sessions.

Parents/Guardians/Caregivers and/or Students (18 years or older) who wish to participate in one of these free online tutoring services should contact the company directly to learn more about their services and the registration process.

Sikh Heritage Month at the Toronto District School Board April 2023

Sikh Heritage Month has proudly been recognized at the TDSB during the month of April since 2016. The TDSB became the first school board in Canada to designate April of each year as Sikh Heritage Month. This designation matches the recognition by the Province of Ontario that proclaimed the Sikh Heritage Month Act in December 2013, and the recognition proclaimed by the Government of Canada on April 30, 2019. Sikh Heritage Month is recognized nationally across Canada.

Sikh Canadians have lived in Ontario since the turn of the twentieth century. They have made significant contributions to the growth and prosperity of Ontario and their traditions and culture continue to be a vibrant part of every aspect of life of Canadians today.

This year our theme is Kes. Kes is one of five Kakaars, indicators that Sikh individuals must acknowledge as part of their faith. The five Kakaars are five sacred articles of faith prescribed by Guru Gobind Singh Ji. They are also known as the 'Five Ks' because each one starts with letter K representing Kakka in the Punjabi language. The five K's are:

i) Kes; ii) Kirpan; iii) Karra; iv) Kangha; v) Kacchera.

We are inviting all TDSB community, students, and staff to join our virtual Sikh Heritage Month launch to recognize the contributions of Sikh Canadians. Lastly, during the month of April Sikh Canadians recognize Vaisakhi, also known as Khalsa Day, which celebrates the Sikh New Year across Ontario. Latin-America History Month at the TDSB - April 2023

Latin-America History Month is proudly recognized at the TDSB during the month of April because of a motion passed through our Board of Trustees in 2016. This year the theme to mark Latin-America History Month is (Decolonizing) Latin-America History Month & Beyond: Honouring & Uplifting the Real Hxstroies and Multiplicities of our Identities.

The "x" in HXSTORIES was chosen to decentre patriarchal HIStories and tell our multiples storieshistorical, lived, and living. "The X is intended to reflect the many distinct identities struggles, an intersectionalities as a inclusive and progressive term. The X is a way of recognizing our untold histories and pushing forward collectively to recover what has been stolen from us." Since it's creation of the Latin-America History Month Volunteer planning committee in 2016, the membership, comprised of educators, community organizers, parents and TDSB staff and alumni continues to ensure that we are reflective of all intersectional differences within our communities of Latin-America/Abya Yala / Pachamana and its disspora.

This year we focus on centring, honouring and uplifting our real hxstories, both pre-colonial, and the realities of present-day due to colonization. We also centre, honour and uplift the multiplicities of our identities-recognizing fundamentally that our communities are not monolithic across all intersectional identity markers. We collectively push back on the "boxes" that have imposed on our communities and take up the transformative power there is when we honour and uplift ourselves and each other in our totality, Several activities are being planned for students, staff, and community members. We invite everyone to join us at the Latin-America History Month virtual launch: Save the Date: Thursday, April 13, 2:00 - 3:00 pm.

TDSB students from all grade levels were invited to participate in a Creative Arts Contest. All students will also be provided with the opportunity to learn about the connections across the continent of the Americas through the Condor and Eagle Prophecy, learn through the storytelling of pre-colonial hxstories through the uplifting of Afro-Indigenous roots, and the realities of present-day through the powerful tool that music brings with Ruben Beny Esguerra (Canadian musical artist/poet based in Toronto and has been nominated twice for a JUNO Award.)

We're also extremely proud to have author Leonarda Carranza read her recent book to our young students, Abuelita and Me in both English and Spanish and lead us through a discussion in alignment with this year's theme.

Students will also have the opportunity through a Beyond Just a Career: Latin-America/Abya Yala/Pachamama Diaspora in K-12 Education panel to connect with leaders and learn about their intertwined personal, educational, and professional journey towards intentionally choosing to follow their calling into an educational space.

Hispanic Heritage Month at the TDSB - April 2023

During the month of April the TDSB recognizes Hispanic Heritage Month. In March 2010, our TDSB Board of Trustees voted that April be designated as Hispanic Heritage Month at the Toronto District School Board.

As stated in the Hispanic Month Act, (May 5, 2015): "Ontario is home to more than 400,000 first-, second- and third- generation Canadians of Hispanic origin. As early as 1914, Canadians who originated from 23 Hispanic countries began immigrating to the province and today the Hispanic community is one of the fastest growing in Ontario. Hispanic-Canadians represent a dynamic community that has made significant contributions to the growth and prosperity of the Province of Ontario.

By proclaiming the month of October as Hispanic Heritage Month in Ontario, the province recognizes the rich contributions of Hispanic-Canadians to our social economic status, political and multicultural fabric. Hispanic Heritage Month is an opportunity to remember, celebrate and educate future generations about the outstanding achievements and contributions of Hispanic people in the province."

Asian Heritage Month at the TDSB: Call-Out for Poster Design 2023

Asian Heritage Month is recognized formally throughout Canada through an official declaration that was signed in May 2002 and the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) passed a motion to recognize Asian Heritage Month in April 2007. According to the 2017 TDSB Student & Parent Census, 40% of TDSB students self-identified as Asian. We are proud to celebrate the numerous achievements of Asian-Canadians and their significant role on the global stage.

This year's theme is: Joining Our Table: Celebrating Asian Canadians.
