The Canadian Chemistry Contest (CCC)

On April 19, 2022 4 AYJ students participated in the 4 hour CCO/CCC contest.

It is my great pleasure to share that grade 11 student Vico C. has earned a Silver Medal in the CCO and will receive a \$1000 prize. He also earned a Merit Certificate in the CCC. He has been invited to prepare for the International Olympiad by attending the IChO camp. The top 4 students, after the camp final exam, will go to the IChO (<u>http://icho2022.cn/</u>). Currently he is in 6th place.

Vico is currently preparing for the final exam in June.

Here is some relevant information about this contest:

The Canadian Chemistry Contest (CCC) is carried out in conjunction with the <u>Canadian Chemistry</u> <u>Olympiad (CCO)</u>. The CCC fosters an appreciation of chemistry as a career for talented young people and promotes national excellence in chemistry at the high school/Cégep level. Over 600 students write this exam annually, in conjunction with the CCO exam. The CCC is aimed at the top 10% of Canadian high school and cégep students under 20 years of age taking chemistry. The CCO is aimed at the top 5% of these students.

Waterloo CHEM 13 Contest

Fifteen AYJ students participated in the Waterloo CHEM 13 contest on May 12, 2022.

Please congratulate the following students for their outstanding results in the Grade 12 Waterloo CHEM 13 Competition.

Lucy L. placed 16th in Canada, 77th in the World and is in the 98th percentile.

Vico C. placed 17th in Canada, 80th in the World and is in the 98th percentile.

Vico is in Grade 11.

Samuel H. placed 24th in Canada and is in the 97th percentile

Henry R. placed 57th in Canada and is in the 93 percentile

Shairahavan S. placed 73rd in Canada and is in the 91st percentile

Natalie L. placed 82nd in Canada and is in the 90th percentile.

These 6 students will be receiving an Elemental Tile from Waterloo University as they all ranked in the top 90th percentile.

Sophia W., Cheryl C. and Christina W. placed above the 80th percentile.

Asian Heritage Month is recognized formally throughout Canada through an official declaration that was signed in May 2002 (<u>https://www.canada.ca/en/canadian-heritage/campaigns/asian-heritage-month/official-declaration.html</u>). Subsequently, the Province of Ontario passed the Asian Heritage Act (2005) (<u>https://www.ontario.ca/laws/statute/05a10</u>), and the Toronto (TDSB) passed a motion to recognize Asian Heritage Month in April 2007

We are proud to celebrate the numerous achievements of Asian-Canadians and their significant role on the global stage. This year our theme is Many Voices United as One

The TDSB is the largest and one of the most diverse school boards in Canada. Nearly one-quarter of our students were born outside of Canada and collectively we speak more than 120 languages. According to the 2017 TDSB Student & Parent Census 40% of TDSB students self-identified as Asian.

All month long, the UIEC is hosting several events and celebrations with Dr. Elder Duke Redbird, Dr. Pamela Palmater, Ange Loft, David A. Robertson, Becky Han and others, along with <u>Two-Spirit & Indigiqueer Pride</u>.

During the month of June, the TDSB recognizes National Indigenous Peoples Day, which is celebrated on Tuesday, June 21. This year, UIEC will have a board-wide virtual celebration on Friday, June 17.

This is a day of significance for many Indigenous Peoples in the country we call Canada today. It marks the day when the Sun is closest to the Earth. It is the longest day of the year and the shortest night. Many First Nations, Métis and Inuit peoples celebrate the Summer Solstice. It is a time that reminds us to remain grounded, humble and appreciative. It is usually celebrated by coming together with family and community for a feast. Traditional foods are an important aspect of the feast as they signify connection to the land and animals.
