Late Assignments

Students must communicate with the teacher in advance if they anticipate that an assignment will be late. Different situations will require specific decisions based on professional judgment. Missed Evaluations

A student who misses an evaluation must submit, upon return to class, a parental/guardian note or a doctor's note detailing the reason for the absence.
