Each student's final mark will be in the form of a percentage grade based on their achievement in the 4 strands indicated on the next page. The breakdown of the final mark is as follows:

The final evaluation will be completed during the final 6 weeks of the course and may include a variety of summative activities including an exam, a presentation, a seminar, an essay or another writing assignment. In addition to students' performance in the achievement categories, students will also be assessed on their performance in the following learning skills:

Late Assignments
