Assessment and Evaluation

To promote student success, ongoing assessment and feedback will be given regularly to the students. A variety of assessment and evaluation strategies will be used in this course, including: final portfolio; written tests and quizzes; independent study; and, written responses. Expectations will be evaluated based on the provincial curriculum expectations and the achievement levels outlined in the ministry document.

Expectations are organized into four categories of knowledge and skills. The categories are as follows:

Knowledge and Understanding Thinking Communication Application

Each student's final mark will be in the form of a percentage grade based on their achievement in the 4 categories on the achievement chart. The breakdown of the final mark is as follows:

The final Evaluation will be completed during the final 6 weeks of the course and may include a variety of summative activities including an exam, a presentation, a seminar, or an essay or another writing assignment.

In addition to students' performance in the achievement categories, students will also be assessed on their performance in the following learning skills:

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EVALUATION PROCEDURES

CUMULATIVE EVALUATION

Fifty (50) percent of the grade will be based on assessments and evaluations conducted throughout the course. These marks are based upon classroom material and assignments.

Five (5) Percent Reviews

All students will be required to **submit written reviews of one of the following events**: Piano Night, Battle of the Bands, or Music Nights (non-participants only).

Five (5) Percent tasks.

These tasks will be based upon the creative, theoretical, technical aspects of the content studied in class.

Ten (10) Percent

Written tests based upon material studied in class

SUMMATIVE EVALUATION will be based on an evaluation of:

Thirty (30) Percent

A final evaluation based upon a set design project and accompanying portfolio.
