Principal's Update - Marc

- Staff are so happy to have kids back in the school after a short virtual session
- Balmy is starting to allow a few more activities within the school
- Staff are working closely with Ms Lombardi to make sure kids are starting to have fun at school again
- Melissa Jacobs and Keri Buck are now official office staff
- It would be nice to reach out to Susan and Kelly to recognise them and their years of contribution to the school
- It would also be nice to reach out to Ms Routley and Ms McCubin
- When we can, we need to recognise retired staff and show them some appreciation
- Ice on sidewalk the school only has one care taker at a time, melting snow off of the slope along Pine Avenue onto sidewalk is making it difficult to clear, but the TDSB should be sending a crew to help clear it
- Heating elements are working to decrease icicles along south side of building, working toward having something similar put in along the north side too
- Report cards come out next week, parent teacher interviews happen next week too
- Gaps in learning are a bit bigger than usual, Mr Green is working with each teacher and Ms Gillan to make sure those gaps get closed
- Olympics at Balmy
 - Ms Lombardi is the best Phys Ed teacher in the TDSB!
 - The Balmy Olympics are the most inclusive school olympics activity Marc has ever seen within a school
 - Classes have chosen their own country, made their own medals, there is a complete schedule of activities, and all classes are participating
 - Wonderful to see the kids having fun and getting a break from the usual routine
- We are celebrating African heritage throughout the month of February
 - Balmy will have a live website at the end of the month showcasing all the work that is being done to celebrate
 - Teachers are still using and talking about the anti racism workshop from the fall
 - They continue to discuss indigenous culture too (ie. looking at land acknowledgement and what it means) as well as gender identity to make sure Balmy is an inclusive space

- Projected numbers for next year are 40 students short (mostly in kindergarten) this will impact staffing

Enrichment – JungleSport - Marc and Melissa

- Working with a lemonade stand idea for the spring
- Nice to tie that into Balmy Fun Week
- Possibly end of March, early April
- Balmy Fun Week could include a School Colours day, Staff Appreciation, the Mini Fundraiser, Choose your Own Adventure day for each class

Eco Calendar and Eco Activities - Kristen speaking on behalf of Laura

- Council would like to offer students and families ways to engage the kids at home in environmental awareness through small micro movements and activities
- Use the new eco calendar, but could focus in on one activity
- International Polar Bear Day happens at the end of this month, we will come up with ideas to celebrate that
- Balmy used to be an Eco School Gold level, school was evaluated based on their eco activities (turning off the lights, recycling, paper use, etc...)
 - Teacher run, build committees with the student body, make posters, talks in classes, however there are no extracurriculars right now
 - This could be an amazing stepping stone back toward becoming an eco school
 - Azadeh asked if it's possible to have a vegetable garden. There are some challenges, but Marc would be open to it.
 - The butterfly garden is also a possibility
 - Council can work on a proposal for it
 - Get kids involved in maintaining it

Callout for Parent Class Reps - Michelle

- One or two parents from each classroom who are the line of communication between the classroom and council
- About half of the teachers have a parent rep
- Class reps are to liaise between council and classrooms
- Michelle to email all current class reps with info about their role

Callout for Grad Committee - Hayley

- Hayley has reached out to Nancy to get some information about last year
- Hayley will reach out to get volunteers
- Plan A and B, hoping for outdoor event, but proceed with a covid safe plan for now

- Melissa will connect with Hayley to help her get in touch with parents who have run it in the past
- \$2000 has already been approved
