PITRÉ. A challenging time to start at a new school but she is eager, organized and prepared and we know the community will welcome her with open arms.

COVID-19 UPDATE:

We have had the pleasure of supporting Mrs. Pitre and Mrs. Berger over the summer with the Safe Return to School program and the administration has been working hard on behalf of our children to ensure all the right measures are in place within the Board restrictions.

We understand that parents have lots of concerns regarding the safety, policies, and protocols in place. Parent Council Executive did agree to use available funds to fund numerous recommendations, such as portable air filtration units, hand washing stations, etc. However, at present, the Board is not allowing these purchases by Parent Councils we are awaiting confirmation as to the types of items we are allowed to fund. We have also been participating over the summer in the ward forums conducted by Rachel Chernos-Lin to stay abreast of what is happening in our ward and, as per the Parent Concerned Protocol, went to the Trustee and Superintendent to get resolution where appropriate.

New TDSB COVID-19 Practices

Please review carefully.

Thank you for reviewing these practices with your child(ren) prior to the first day of school.

This section is an extension of the TDSB's publication "<u>Operational Guidelines – Elementary</u>" as we add detail specific to Bedford Park while under COVID-19 restrictions.

Toronto Public Health reminds us to stay at home when we are not feeling well. It is important for every family to do their part for the health and safety of students and staff.

To help with the morning routine, the TDSB has generated a "Daily Checklist for Elementary School"!

It is very important that you establish a routine with your child(ren) to arrive at school on time: backpack ready with all materials, 2 masks, boomerang lunch and snacks (garbage will be taken home), and water bottle filled with water. Arriving on time to school sets everyone up for success with a positive mindset.

Every entry door will have a screening station with a symptom poster, a bottle of hand sanitizer, and a Bedford Staff member who will complete a screening assessment prior to every student's entry.

Students arriving late will enter using the main doors and will receive a late slip from the incredible office staff. Depending on the age of the student, a staff member will walk the students to their classrooms. See the TDSB's "Safe Return to School and Work Daily Health Screening" page to review the paper pass and the health screening app for daily screening. We strongly encourage you to download the app for efficiency in the morning!

Very often parents will drop-off lunches or items students have forgotten at home. This is going to be strongly discouraged. We are limiting hallway traffic as well as the number of people entering the building. Please try your very best to send your child to school with everything that is needed for the entire day. A drop-off table will be put in the stairwell of the main entrance where you will be asked to leave any items you absolutely have to drop off. Office staff will not be calling students down to pick up the items.

When a student needs to be picked up early, please send a note or an email to the teacher and the office staff. The student will wait for you in the main office.



Everyone entering the main office is required to wear a mask. Please see the TDSB website for "<u>Mask and Face Covering Requirements</u>" for staff, students, and visitors.

Teachers will establish a handwashing routine with your child for every entry to the classroom as well as before eating snacks and lunch. Classrooms with washrooms will be used by that class. Washrooms in the hallways will have a reduced number of stalls to be used. The capacity limit will be posted outside the washroom.

For right now, hooks and lockers will not be used. Students will use the back of their chair to

hang coats and backpacks. Classroom teachers will establish a space where boots may be kept and accessed while doing our best to maintain social distancing.

Students are to come to school with their water bottles filled. While we await the arrival of our water bottle filling station, some of our water fountains will be open for water bottle filling only. Posters will be set up over the fountain for **x**^{*} filling water bottles only.

It is highly recommended by TDSB that students remain at school for lunch. Should they be going offsite, they are to go directly home to eat and return at the 12:20 pm bell for entry.



New TDSB COVID-19 Practices

Snacks and lunches are to be "grab-and-go". All garbage will be taken home. Utensils will not be shared or provided. All food will be eaten in the classroom and lunch eaten the regularly scheduled lunch period (see page 8).

Special food days are on hold (e.g., Pizza Lunch).

Food deliveries will not be accepted (e.g., homemade lunch, Uber Eats, Skip the Dishes, DoorDash).

Students may bring their own technology to school with the knowledge that any device lost, stolen, or damaged is not the responsibility of Bedford Park PS.

Unfortunately, the pool will be closed until further notice.

When you are trying to connect with your child's teachers, please use email to establish a date and time when you can speak over the phone call or set up a virtual meeting (e.g., Google Meet or Zoom).

When students and staff feel unwell throughout the school day, we have a comfortable space for them to remain safe and supervised. The Wellness Room will include all PPE (gown, shield, masks, and alcohol-based sanitizer). After each use, this room will be disinfected. Parents will be contacted immediately by Bedford office staff. If the first two contacts cannot be reached, we will move to your emergency contacts. It is very important that all of your contact information be up-to-date as well as current emergency contacts.

Each teacher will maintain a Google Classroom or Brightspace platform where assignments and information are shared with parents. Depending on the grade level, assignments may be submitted this way as well. This is NOT a replacement for in-class learning. Students who are away for a couple of days can look to Google Classroom or Brightspace to see some of the work that was missed; however, it will not have all the learning and/or assignments that happened in the classroom on any given day. Most of our students are familiar with how to use Google Classroom after our distance learning from April to June. Your child's teacher will let you know what their preferred means of communication will be.

Thank you for helping everyone stay safe by following these new practices.





Secure Access Systems A Reminder to You

As per Operational Procedure PR663, we have a secure access system at our main entry that gives our Staff more control over who enters our school. The outside doors will be locked and a buzzer system is to be used to gain access to the front of the school. Using this system will provide a safe, welcoming environment, and a single point of entry where visitors will be directed to the office. Thank you! Merci!

Anaphylaxis Taking the Necessary Precautions



Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that can be life threatening. This medical condition can cause a severe reaction to specific foods or other materials, and can result in death within minutes. Although foods such as peanuts, milk, eggs, and sesame seeds are the most common cause of anaphylaxis, insect stings, medicine, or latex can also cause a reaction. In recent years, anaphylaxis has increased dramatically among students. The TDSB is committed to maintaining a safe and healthy learning environment for all students and works with Toronto Public Health and other partners to ensure the successful implementation of Sabrina's Law, which came into effect on January 1, 2006.

Although this may not affect your child's class directly, we want to raise awareness about this life-threatening condition. Students who have severe allergies to such food substances are exposed to a severe health risk when such products are consumed in their environment or shared with them. As prevention is the best approach, we ask that you speak with your child about not sharing their snacks or lunches with other students and please do not send any snacks or lunches with your child that contain peanuts.

If your child has health problems of any kind, please inform your child's teacher or office staff immediately so that the necessary health protection steps may be taken and to ensure everyone's co-operation for a safe learning environment.

Parents, children, and teachers have always argued about homework! Common questions include: Should teachers give homework to students? If so, how much and what type of homework should be assigned? How much time should students spend on homework? What roles should parents play in their child's homework?

Quite a bit of research has been done over the decades on homework, but researchers still hold divergent views on the subject.


The best current evidence is that homework seems to have a small positive influence on student achievement, though it may be that students with better grades just tend to do more homework. The evidence for a positive impact of homework on student achievement in the primary grades is weak, although some evidence suggests that homework may help students develop good study habits and foster positive attitudes toward school and learning.

Parents can also play an important role by supporting their children's learning at home, encouraging learning outside of school, and monitoring their children's progress regularly. It is important to be positive and encouraging when working with your children on homework; if homework leads to bad feelings between parents and children it can have negative effects on both school and home relationships.
