Dear Parents/Guardians,

As we all prepare for a much-needed winter break, the TDSB is planning ahead for the New Year and what learning may look like as we return to school in January. As cases of COVID-19 continue to rise in Toronto, so too does the possibility of individual classes, schools, or the system moving to remote learning for a period of time. As a result, we want to be as prepared as possible. It is important to note that any decision on the closure of a school or the system is made based on the advice of public health officials or the provincial government and is not made by the TDSB. We have received no indication that schools will close, however, we do want to make sure we are prepared to implement any decision smoothly and efficiently and continue to support our students' learning and well-being.

Grade 4 Middle Immersion

This is a special message to all Grade 3 Bedford families!

The central system-wide application process for the **NEW** Middle French Immersion Program will begin in January 2021. The first cohort will begin September 2021. The Middle French Immersion application process opens on **04 January 2021** and the deadline to apply online is **29 January 2021**. NB: This program will replace the Junior Extended French program as the Grade 4 entry program in the TDSB.

This year, there will be no print packages distributed due to the current circumstances. Instead, **all** Grade 3 families (both in the 4 elementary virtual schools and in-person schools) will receive a message including the information package via SchoolMessenger.

This year, the FSL Department will host three virtual information sessions. They are scheduled on the following dates/times:

- January 14, 2021 10 am
- January 21, 2021 7 pm
- January 27, 2021 7 pm

Daily Reminders



To start our days off on the right foot, we would like to remind families of the following:

Every morning, the daily health screening process is to be completed with the Mobile Now App or using the Paper Passport Paper. Prior to entry, Bedford staff are checking to ensure this is completed for every student. Help us get into the classroom even faster by completing the daily health screening self-assessment every morning. If your child is not feeling well in the morning, we respectfully ask that you keep them at home.

There are many daily items that need to be remembered:

- Water bottle: Fountains are open for water bottle filling only; therefore, students need their clean water bottles every day;
- o Boomerang lunch: All garbage is coming home;
- o **Utensils for lunch**: Cutlery will not be provided by the school when forgotten; and
- Winter clothing: Be sure your child is dressed for the weather, has an extra pair of socks, and indoor shoes when outdoor footwear is needed!

Remember to bring back your indoor shoes when you return in January!!

Research shows that providing children with opportunities for positive teamwork opportunities (e.g., playing on a sports team with other children) can decrease anxiety and enhance peer relationships. Increased social skills learned through teamwork can also lead to enhanced self-esteem.


Goals


- To help our students understand the meaning of teamwork.

- To help our students think about the different ways they can work together as a team of individuals, as a classroom, and as a school.






































Toronto Public Health

Guidance for the Holiday Season

Toronto is still under Lockdown (Grey Zone under the Provincial COVID-19 Response Framework). Toronto Public Health has prepared a Holiday Guide with information on how you and your family can safely plan for and celebrate the holiday season this year.

The Holiday Guide includes information on:

- Shopping and gift giving.
- Alternative ways to celebrate with family and friends.
- Making events memorable.
- Accessing religious rites and services.
- Managing holiday stress.
- Making donations.

Additional information about gift giving and celebrations specific to the school community is available here.

As we continue to see high rates of COVID-19 cases in Toronto, it is very important that you and your family continue to follow these public health measures:

- Stay home except for essential trips, such as work, school, or healthcare visits.
- Stay home if you have COVID-19 symptoms, even if they are mild, self-isolate, and arrange to get tested.
- Limit gatherings in your home to the people you live with. If you live alone, you may include one person from outside your household.
- Go out for fresh air and exercise only with the people
- Check in with vulnerable family members, friends, and neighbours virtually or by phone.
- Download the COVID Alert App to be notified if you were close to someone who is contagious with COVID-19.
