### Trinket & Toronto Therapy Dogs

Has your child told you about Trinket, the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel that visits our school? We are truly lucky to have an ongoing connection with Sue Jamieson and Trinket, a St. John Ambulance therapy dog who has been visiting Bessborough since the 2015-2016 school year. I asked Sue to please share some information about Trinket who is VERY popular. Thank you, Sue for telling us about your own and Trinket's important work, and for sharing these photos!

"Trinket has been doing Pet Therapy visits for a little over 6.5 years. We started with Therapeutic Paws of Canada but are now with St. John Ambulance Therapy Dogs. Her first "job" was at Sunnybrook Veterans Residence where we continue to visit every Monday morning. The unit that we visit is for end stage Alzheimer's residents. The residents aren't always able to interact with Trinket, so any smile she brings to their faces are a joy.





We also started at Sunnybrook Palliative care about two and a half years ago. This is the highlight of our week and we are always sorry when our visits to this special unit are over. It is quite amazing how uplifting these visits are and these dear people who don't have much longer truly enjoy Trinket. She is especially good with palliative patients. Trinket often falls asleep on people's beds and because sleepy visits make for good visits, no one reports her for falling asleep on the job.

This is Trinket's 4<sup>th</sup> year visiting Bessborough Elementary and Middle School. We originally started visiting the little grade 1 students and I believe that they must now be in 4<sup>th</sup> grade. It is fun to meet our old friends in the hall or sometimes just walking in the neighborhood...so many stop to say hello.

Trinket is truly a funny little girl...she doesn't do dog parks. Her favourite thing is to sit at outdoor cafes and watch the world go by. She is an observer. I do believe that she is meant to be shared with others."

#### Career Day & My Blueprint

Thank you, Ms. Angheloni for organizing Career Day on Thursday December 6<sup>th</sup>! It was a terrific experience for our Grade 7 and Grade 8 students. All Grade 8 students have now completed *My Blueprint* in preparation for high school.

Thank you to Shannon McLeod and Jim Corbett from the TDSB's Ontario Youth Apprentice Program (OYAP) for their introduction to OYAP and the Co-Op program! Students enjoyed learning about trades at sessions by TDSB skilled trades staff.

Christopher developed this programme after seeing too many of his undergraduate students struggle unnecessarily in university. BridgesEDU helps enhance critical thinking skills, analytical reading and writing, and scholarship applications.


