

February is African Heritage Month

At the Toronto District School Board, a motion to recognize African Heritage (Black History) Month was carried in January 2002 and reaffirmed again in January 2004. At Bessborough, students are engaged in learning about Black leaders in Canadian society both in class and on the morning announcements. As well, a team of Bessborough teachers are working with TDSB Equity Coaches from the Centre for Black Excellence to re-examine teaching and learning and to utilize texts that celebrate Black excellence and Black culture. Our parent/guardian community will be invited in early April (date and time TBD) to hear Michelle Munroe, Central Coordinator, Parent and Community Engagement who will lead a parent workshop entitled, "Raising an Anti-Racist Child". February is Chinese Heritage Month

The Toronto District School Board is proud to recognize Chinese Heritage Month (CHM) during the month of February 2023. This year marks the Year of the Rabbit, which began on Sunday, January 22, 2023. At TDSB, the theme *Year of the Rabbit: Kind, Generous, and Harmonious* is being celebrated. This year, the Chinese Heritage Committee selected a second theme: *Honouring a Legacy of Conviction and Fortitude* to mark the 100th anniversary of the *Chinese Immigration Act of 1923* (known as the Chinese Exclusion Act). This Act restricted all people of Chinese descent from immigrating into Canada for 24 years with only 15 Chinese immigrants allowed entry into Canada from 1923 to 1946. Parliament officially repealed the act on May 14, 1947 and in 2006, the Government of Canada issued an official apology to Chinese Canadians; *Chinese Immigration Act*, 1923. At Bessborough, students will be engaged in learning about Chinese leaders and their contributions to Canadian society in the classroom and through the daily announcements.
