

# Willesden Reads: The Canadian Premier of The Willesden Project

On Wednesday, February 1<sup>st</sup>, students at Bessborough in Grades 6-8 watched a livestream presentation of Mona Golabek, presenting "The Children of Willesden Lane". This presentation, which was brought to the TDSB by Liberation75 in collaboration with the TDSB Jewish Heritage Committee, tells the true story of Mona Golabek's mother, Lisa Jura, a 14-year-old piano prodigy living in Vienna in 1938, "where it quickly became dangerous to be Jewish". Students were transfixed as Mona told her mother's story and performed on the piano. Here is what some of our students said about the impact of this performance:

"I felt that the story was very eye opening, pure honesty, which I really appreciated because it does not make light of the Holocaust." Bayla

  - Deadline for parents/guardians of students to be informed of the status of the Out-of-Area Application (February 8, 2023)
  - Deadline for families to confirm acceptance of the Out-of-Area offer (February 14, 2023)
- Round 2
  - Deadline for parents/guardians of students to be informed of the status of the Out-of-Area Application (February 15, 2023)
  - Deadline for families to confirm acceptance of the Out-of-Area offer (February 21, 2023)
- Final round
  - Deadline for parents/guardians of students to be informed of the status of the Out-of-Area Application (February 22, 2023)
  - Deadline for families to confirm acceptance of the Out-of-Area offer (February 24, 2023)
- Students must finalize their destination for secondary school (designated school by address, Central Program, Alternative School, Out-of-Area Admission) by completing and submitting the corresponding course selection for the accepted school in myBlueprint (February 27, 2023)
- Course selection deadline (February 27, 2023)
- Parent/Teacher interviews
- Complete Individual Pathways Plan task(s)
