

## **Online Safety Presentation**

This past week, our grade 5-8 students attended an online safety presentation with Nicole Singer, a TDSB school social worker. The presentation was focused on social media and cyber-safety. Some key takeaways from the presentation included:

- posting on social media means that you no longer control the information you have posted
- social media messages are always public and not private and there is no real way to delete a message once it has been posted
- private information should never be shared online e.g., phone numbers, addresses, the school you attend or any information that could identify a student's location
- don't communicate with strangers online
- examples of what cyber-bullying can look like: sending and sharing stories/pictures that are embarrassing or untrue; pretending to be someone else online; sending mean or threatening messages
- some online sites are meant for older users; some sites online are filled with "toxic" images and messages and students should not be on these sites (digitally responsible citizens do not go on these sites)

Supporting our students to be good digital citizens is something that we will continue to review and teach in different curriculum areas throughout the year. Parents can help by making sure devices have parental controls in place, by regularly having conversations with their children about good digital citizenship, and by closely monitoring their children when they are online.

This coming week students will have another presentation on Healthy Peer Relationships.

### Middle French Immersion-Registration Open Now

Applications to the Middle French Immersion program may be submitted, on behalf of students in the English program, the year the child is in Grade 3 for entry in September of Grade 4. It is an entirely online process. All communication will be sent via the email address you provide. Please check your email regularly, including junk mail folders.

- You will need your child's date of birth and OEN. The OEN is a 9-digit number found on any report card from the TDSB.
- For non-TDSB students, please select the "Non-TDSB Student" option and follow the steps to generate an identification number. You must then return to the PARS site and follow the application procedure with this number.
- Please select Middle French Immersion from the drop-down menu and complete the application process.

On-time applicants will be offered a placement via the email address you have provided. You MUST take action to reserve a spot by the deadline requested when you are offered a placement. Offers of placement will be on-going through the weeks and months following the close of the application period. *Please check your email regularly, including junk mail folders, and follow any instructions.*

### **February**

- Grade 8 Course Selection Opens for all students via <u>myBlueprint</u> (February 6, 2023)
- Round 1
  - Deadline for parents/guardians of students to be informed of the status of the Out-of-Area Application (February 8, 2023)
  - Deadline for families to confirm acceptance of the Out-of-Area offer (February 14, 2023)
- Round 2
  - Deadline for parents/guardians of students to be informed of the status of the Out-of-Area Application (February 15, 2023)
  - Deadline for families to confirm acceptance of the Out-of-Area offer (February 21, 2023)
- Final round
  - Deadline for parents/guardians of students to be informed of the status of the Out-of-Area Application (February 22, 2023)
  - Deadline for families to confirm acceptance of the Out-of-Area offer (February 24, 2023)
