Vaccine Clinic at Bessborough-June 20

Spring Clinic: Toronto Public Health (TPH) staff will be returning to **Bessborough Junior and Senior Public School** on **Tuesday June 20, 2023** to give Grade 7 and 8 students their first or next dose of the vaccines in the School Immunization Program: <u>Hepatitis B, Human Papillomavirus</u> and <u>Meningococcal ACYW-135</u>. To be protected from Hepatitis B and HPV, most students need two doses of these vaccines, given 6 months apart.

Missed Vaccines: If your child misses the spring clinic, these vaccines are also available for eligible students, free of cost, at <u>City-run clinics</u>. If your child received a first dose of hepatitis B or HPV vaccines from a health care provider or at a City Immunization Clinic, TPH can administer any missing doses at the school clinic if a signed consent form is received.

Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA): Under ISPA, all Ontario students are required to be up-to-date with Meningococcal vaccine or have a valid exemption. To request an exemption, email SchoolVaccines@toronto.ca. Parents/guardians of students who have not yet received the vaccines being offered at this clinic may receive a letter or phone call from TPH to remind them of options to get their child vaccinated.

Consent forms: Complete, sign and return the <u>School Immunization Consent Form</u> only if you have not already completed one for your child. Paper copies of the form may be available from the school office.

Already Vaccinated?: If your child has received one or more of these vaccines from their healthcare provider, <u>report your child's vaccination(s)</u> using the Immunization Connect Ontario (ICON) online tool. Visit <u>Toronto.ca/StudentVaccines</u> for more information.

At Bessborough we will be learning about outstanding Indigenous Canadians on the morning announcements. Learning about Indigenous culture and history has been part of classroom learning as well. As an example, the students in Mr. King's grade 5 classroom have written their own Land Acknowledgements, demonstrating their understanding of Indigenous Treaty Issues. Two of the students in this class read their Land Acknowledgements at a recent meeting of the school principals and vice-principals in our learning network.

Next Pediculosis Screening at Bessborough: June 6 in the PM

The Pediculosis nurse was at Bessborough this past week and checked the classes in the primary division as well as the Grade ¾ class. She did not find any cases of head lice. Thanks very much to families who have been checking their child's head at home and cases of head lice treated when found. It is clearly helping.

On June 6th students in the Junior division will be checked in the afternoon (Grade 4, Grade 5, Grade 5/6, and Grade 6). For families who do not wish to have their child checked at school please let the office or your child's teacher know and we ask that you check your child's head at home. This will help to stop the spread.

Here are helpful tips to stop the spread of head lice from Toronto Public Health:

- Teach your child(ren) how head lice are spread.
- Discourage head-to-head contact and sharing of hats, scarves, hairbrushes, and combs.
- Tie long hair back in braids.
- Check the head of young school age children weekly for head lice; more often if there is an outbreak.
- Routinely check the heads of all people living in the household for head lice.
- Treat all people with head lice in the household at the same time.
- If someone in your household has head lice, tell all people who have close contact with the person with head lice to check their heads, including the child's teacher and/or daycare worker.
