### **Head Lice**

We are asking families to check their children for nits and lice. This will help to stop the spread. Here are helpful tips to stop the spread of head lice from Toronto Public Health:

- Teach your child(ren) how head lice are spread.
- Discourage head-to-head contact and sharing of hats, scarves, hairbrushes, and combs.
- Tie long hair back in braids.
- Check the head of young school age children weekly for head lice; more often if there is an outbreak.
- Routinely check the heads of all people living in the household for head lice.
- Treat all people with head lice in the household at the same time.
- If someone in your household has head lice, tell all people who have close contact with the person with head lice to check their heads, including the child's teacher and/or daycare worker.

## Care, Belonging and Responsibility Event: May 17<sup>th</sup>, 7-8:30 PM

### Message from Leaside High School Council

On behalf of Leaside High School Council, we would like to invite the Parents, Guardians, and Caregivers in your school community to an upcoming event: **Calling In: Care, Belonging & Responsibility' an Online Arts Based Parent Event.** This is a FREE online session taking place on **May 17th from 7-8:30 pm.** You can find a poster for the event here: <u>POSTER Calling In Care Belonging and Responsibility May 17 2023 (1).pdf</u>

What is it? An online arts-based experiential exploration of how our parenting and caregiving can help to nurture anti-racist, anti-oppressive ways of being in our school community through compassionate and inclusive practices.

Who is it for? Parents, guardians, and caregivers of students attending schools near to or adjacent to the Leaside community.

Why are we doing it? Every student and family in our school community and beyond shares the right to feel a sense of belonging. As a community, we are working toward this being the case, but we are not there yet. Racism and oppression remain present in our community.

What will we be doing together? Together, we will explore the importance of understanding our identity markers and social location(s) - our power, privilege, and implicit bias and boldly name how dominant cultures impact a sense of inclusion and exclusion in our community - along with the importance of language and the value of creative process using imagery and poetry to express care and facilitate connection. This is an opportunity for parents and caregivers in the Leaside High School community to expand awareness and connection, celebrate diversity, and nourish a sense of collective responsibility for deepening care and strengthening a sense of belonging for everyone.

**Suggested art supplies to have on hand to participate:** A few papers and something to write or draw with, such as pens, pencils, markers, or any other mark-making items. Scissors, magazine (willing to cut out of), and glue -- think of collage.

This is not necessarily about the final product, although you may be surprised. It's more about the process which includes self-reflection, play, creativity, and discovery.

What participants will walk away with? Participants will walk away with an increased understanding and awareness about their own power and privilege within the dominant culture in our community and have some ideas of how to use language, self-awareness, and care in parenting and caregiving practices to help interrupt patterns of harm and nurture relationships and belonging in our community while supporting students to do the same.
