## February Character Trait Focus: Fairness



Your child is involved in learning activities designed to develop good character and help children make good choices. Our focus this month has been on TEAMWORK. For the month of February we will be recognizing FAIRNESS.

### Your child can show fairness by:

- playing and working fairly with others in the family
- treating family members with respect and without prejudice
- treating others in the family in the way that they would like to be treated

### Questions to discuss with your child:

- What is fairness, and what does it mean to be fair?
- Do you treat others the way you would like to be treated?
- When someone is unfair, how does that make you feel?
- Does equality mean that everyone gets the same, or that everyone gets what they need?

### Projects to do together:

- Watch a television program together. Talk about the various ways in which certain characters may have acted unfairly toward each other. Discuss how the situation could have been avoided.
- ~ Think about something that is happening at home, at school, or in the community. What might be done about it? What would your role be?

### **Encouraging fairness in your child:**

- Listen to your child if he or she has a concern or request. Engage in fair discussion to resolve the issue.
- Show that fairness is important, and that it is crucial to treat others with respect and without judgment.
- Share a situation in which you felt you were treated fairly or unfairly, and describe how that impacted your day.

# **Connecting With Our Indigenous Friends Through Letter Writing**



For the second year, my Grade 6 class has partnered with fellow Grade 6 students on First Nations reserves. This year, my class has become pen pals with students in Attawapiskat, Ontario on the shores of James Bay.

The Attawapiskat First Nation is not accessible by car. The letters must be delivered by airplane. In the first letters, the students have shared their "winter experiences" with each other along with some of their hobbies and interests.

The students have learned that temperatures in Attawapiskat during the winter can reach -45C! They have also learned about some of the cultural dishes enjoyed by our new friends, one of them being Moose stew. Some favourite hobbies and activities the children of Attawapiskat like to do are, snowmobiling, hunting and playing outside.

Even though there are numerous differences between the children, they are learning that despite the vast geographic distance between them, they are very similar (Fortnite and online games bring everyone closer!).

This cultural exchange exercise is designed to help our students learn more about the Indigenous peoples of our province in an authentic way. The class hopes to connect with them via Skype before the end of the school year. This is just one way we can do our part toward reconciliation.

We look forward to holding another Trailblazing event in the future! We hope that in the future our presenters will be the students from Beverly Glen!



These students have been selected to train other staff and students from BG, and from other neighbouring schools, on how to use the Read & Write extension that is now accessible for all TDSB students. The Read & Write program is an assistive technology program designed to improve reading comprehension, assist struggling readers process, comprehend large amounts of text, helps users conduct research and it allows struggling writers to produce quality written documents. This program is not only available at school, but it can be easily accessed from home. The goal from the Ambassadors is to ensure that all students are trained and are using this program on a frequent basis.

### National Winter Walk Day

Wednesday, February 16th is Winter Walk Day across Canada. It's the perfect opportunity for parents and kids to get outside together and stretch those legs! Walk to school for daily physical activity, a healthier environment, safer streets, making friends and ... having fun! Walking is the simplest form of exercise and helps kids get those 60 minutes of daily physical activity they need.

Winter is still a great time to walk and be outside and it's also a great cure for those winter blues! Dress properly and don't let cold, wind, snow or rain keep you from heading out for a walk. Below are some great winter weather dressing tips from Green Communities Canada:

- Keep hands and head covered to prevent heat loss;
- Wear warm, waterproof boots;
- Wear a warm coat that deflects the wind;
- Woolen clothing helps to retain heat;
- On really cold days, wear a scarf over your face and mouth;
- If possible, change wet clothes at school;
- Wear clothing or carry knapsacks with reflective material it's important to be seen;
- Below -25 degrees Celsius is considered too cold for walking, so move your walk indoors or select another day.
