You'll experience the book together and learn more about each other in the process. We're welcoming all family members to join us; grandparents, aunts and uncles, babysitters, dogs, cats. You can even read together with someone who lives far away using Facetime or Zoom! Everyone is welcome if they have read the book. Read the back of this notice for more details about the book. At school we will have meetings with students to do fun activities, discuss progress, content and questions that may arise from the book. We will mark our accomplishment with a BC Book Club after-school celebration for all participants; students and grown ups. Our goal is to finish this book by mid February, 2023.
