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Guidance is reminding all grade 12 students that applications for post secondary are due soon: University applications are due January 15, 2021 and College applications are due February 1, 2021


The Peer leaders have met and are planning visits to grade 8 virtual classrooms next week. It will be exciting to meet the students that will be joining our Birchmount Family in September.

Student Success and Gifted

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We hosted virtual meetings with leaders of various curriculum areas. The topic of discussion was how Credit Rescue has been working within each department. Along with each conversation came suggestions on how we can implement the initiative so that it supports our students to be successful academically. Credit Rescue is a Student Success initiative focussed on supporting students as they attempt to complete a course as opposed to having to repeat it. Students are offered extra time by their classroom teachers to submit missed assignments. They can also re-submit assignments to better display their learning of curriculum expectations in hopes of a better mark.

Large-scale check-ins with students have been happening.. In an attempt to support our students as best as possible we have been in touch with them via email, virtual meetings, and telephone. We would like to applaud our students for employing their resilience as they focus on their academic tasks, participate in their online learning environments and stay positive while in the midst of this pandemic.
