Last year, students in grades 1-6 participated in an eight week block of hour long sessions with the Canadian Chess Institute. **Bussing Challenges** 

There have been a number of significant bus delays in recent weeks. It is the responsibility of the bussing company to directly update these delays on the TDSB transportation portal. The bigger challenge has been that the bussing company has not always followed through on this, leaving parents naturally anxious and concerned. This is further complicated by the fact that our school office closes at 4:00 pm, meaning that there is no one here to answer your phone calls. Support staff on bus duty leave at 4:00 pm, requiring Ms. Weinberg and/or me to take over the supervision, another reason why no one is in the office to answer your calls. Pease note that your children are always supervised, and we do our best to communicate with you, however we also deal with the frustrations of getting through to the bus companies to understand about delays when they haven't been communicated to us via the portal system.

Please note that the concerns have been communicated with the TDSB Bussing Department, and we are hoping that they are rectified.
