Digital Library Card

For those who do not currently have a library card, TPL offers a new "instant" digital card. This card gives non-TPL cardholders in Toronto free, temporary access to <u>OverDrive</u>, our largest collection of ebooks and audiobooks which includes children's fiction, non-fiction and picture book titles. Online Programs and Resources
