Pizza Lunch

Beginning September 27th all Blake students will have the opportunity to enjoy Friday Pizza Lunch. A letter and envelope was sent home today with all students. Pizza can be purchased weekly, by term, or for the entire school year. These envelopes will not go home every week, so if you want to purchase pizza weekly, you or your child will need to pick up a pizza envelope in the office each time.

Orders can be paid in cash or cheque made payable to Blake Street PS.

As well, new this year, pizza lunch will be able to be purchased on-line using the Cash Online payment system. Visit https://tdsb.schoolcashonline.com to register. You can then select your order (by term or for the year) and follow the prompts. Weekly pizza orders will NOT be available on-line. All weekly orders must use the pizza envelopes that are available in the office.

Pizza lunches will take place every Friday, except when there is a PA day and then pizza lunches will be moved to Thursdays. With your order of \$5.00, your child will receive 2 slices of pizza, a piece of fruit, and a juice box. Please note that pizza will be ordered through Madina Pizza on Danforth, and is halal.

ALL orders will be due to the office by 3:30 on Wednesdays. In the event of a Friday PA day, orders will be due to the office by Tuesday.

Making weekly large scale pizza orders requires tremendous organization. As such, we cannot roll over pizza or reimburse families for days their child has paid for pizza but may be absent due to illness or holiday.

The funds generated through pizza lunch will continue to support school initiatives, including technology, literacy and numeracy support, and bringing art into our schools.

Cath Online

The Toronto District School Board has launched School Cash Online, an easy to use, safe and convenient way for parents/guardians to pay for their children's school fees, including agendas, yearbooks and class trips. School Cash Online will be available to our school starting the week of **September 16**, **2019**.

All school fees applicable to your child will be posted on School Cash Online. Once you register, you can choose to purchase the items or activities using a debit or credit card. You will be able to see when the school has a new item posted online for purchase and you will also have the option to be notified whenever your child has a new school event requiring payment.

Registration will open the week of September 16, 2019. To register for School Cash Online, please visit https://tdsb.schoolcashonline.com select "Get Started Today" and complete the three registration steps. For more information on the registration process, please see the handout attached to this letter. Once registered, you will receive an email notification when items become available online.

Volunteers Needed for Food Rescue

Blake PS is part of a wonderful food rescue program that diverts perfectly good food from being tossed into the waste stream to becoming part of our snack program. Grocery stores, bakeries, cafes etc., notify the program when they have excess food, usually fruit or bread products, and a call goes out to see who can pick it up and use it. At that point Donna, who coordinates our snack program, sends an email to everyone on our volunteer list with details about what it is and how to pick it up, the same day or the next. If you can do it, you respond to the email, go get it, bring it to Donna at the school and she takes it from there. It gets incorporated into our snack program, or if it is something we can't use Donna knows amazing ways to get it to people who need it. So, if you have a car and could occasionally help out, email Donna at donna.booth@aol.com and let her know so she can put your name on the list. The more volunteers we have, the more food we can rescue.

You can drop off the following items:

- Batteries
- Small electronics including cell phones
- Printers and fax machines (do not bring ink cartridges or toner)
- Household hazardous waste
- Fluorescent bulbs

- Unused medications
- Oils, solvents and pesticides

Or donate the following for reuse:

- Sporting goods (e.g. skates, hockey equipment, bikes, rackets)
- Books (excluding school/university curriculum books)
- Eyeglasses, walking aids, hearing aids, etc.
- Small household items (e.g. dishes, ornaments, kitchen utensils, games, etc.)
- Textiles in good condition (e.g. clothing, linens, etc.)
- Musical instruments
- Arts and crafts supplies
- CD's, CD cases and 35 mm cameras
- Non-perishable foods will be donated to a food bank

Please do not bring: Ink cartridges or toner, construction waste, air conditioners, garbage, wood, cassette and videotapes, commercial/industrial hazardous waste and scrap metal.

The **shredding truck** will be available and there will be **free compost** for pick-up - bring your own containers and shovel. Ward 14 Bikes will also be offering compost delivery by bike.

Local and environmental groups will be exhibiting, including LEAF, Danforth Reduces, Ward 14 Bikes, the Ralph Thornton Community Centre and the Toronto Public Library Riverdale Branch.
