# Class Reorganization News

Every September, schools review actual student enrolment as compared to initial projections from last April, and reorganize classes where required. We do our best to plan for the new school year, but there are always factors, such as new or departing students, that might affect how classrooms are organized. In addition, to ensure smaller class sizes, the Ministry of Education sets out specific class size requirements to benefit student learning.

As a result of changing student enrolment at our school, we have reorganized the English Kindergarten and Junior classrooms to best support our students. We were given an extra full junior allocation, allowing for three full day junior classes (two grade 4/5 classes and a grade 6 class), and an additional Early childhood Educator which will allow Ms. Church's class to grow beyond 15 students. These additional allocations have meant that many of our kindergarten and Junior English students will be changing classrooms and teachers come Monday.

We know that for students and parents, changing classes may be difficult and may require an adjustment period. Students will be supported as they transition through these classroom changes but we are confident in the resiliency of our students. If your child did not bring a letter home this past Wednesday, they have not been affected by the reorganization.

## **Curriculum Night , Thursday September 26**

Parents, guardians and students are invited to join us and take part in our Curriculum Night next Thursday, September 26<sup>th</sup>. This drop in evening provides you with an opportunity to meet your child's teacher, see the classroom, learn about our school initiatives and priorities and explore Blake Street PS with your child.

Immediately following Curriculum Night, we will be hosting a parent engagement session in the library, with a focus on Special Education. This session will run from 7:00 – 7:30, and is specifically for parents and caregivers. Children will be supervised in the gym. This session will work to address your special education questions, and will touch on Individual Education plans, special education programs, and supports. We look forward to seeing you all then.

#### CAT 4 Testing and Universal Screening

Our school is one of 150 schools in the TDSB's Model Schools for Inner Cities program (MSIC). One of the key components of MSIC schools is the ongoing research to help schools identify the needs of their students and their school community, to monitor the progress made by students, and to demonstrate school improvement over time. Next week, students in Grades 2, 4, 5 and 6 will take the Canadian Achievement Test (CAT4) in order to assess their foundation skills in reading, writing and math.

The CAT4 test results will be reported to parents and classroom teachers for improvement purposes. If you have any questions about MSIC research in your child's school, or if you do not want your child to participate in any part of the research, please contact your child's teacher.

All grade 3 students across the TDSB participate in the Universal Screening Process, and all parents and guardians of grade 3 student should have received an information letter last week. The purpose of this screening test is to provide teachers with information to develop a class profile, to support programming, and to support the process of identification for giftedness. If you do not want your child screened, please be sure to let your child's teacher know.

## **Emergency Procedures**

As part of our emergency procedures, all TDSB schools must participate in three fire drills and one lock down drill per term. As of today, we have conducted two fire drills and one lock down drill. These important emergency procedures are regularly reviewed with our students, as our primary concern is always student safety – which comes with practice. Do talk with your children about our safety and evacuation procedures – they have proven themselves to be experts in this regard!!!

#### **WE DAY**

We Day was an excellent experience. We had lots of fun and learned about what the WE community is doing around the world. For example, supplying water to countless communities around the world, and recycling batteries to make air and soil safer. Today we participated in six missions and heard from six different speakers

who inspired us to take action. Stay tuned for more We Club news and activities. A big thanks to Ms. Logan for organizing this field trip and bringing us to this event.
