Please remind them that they are responsible for their own fun. If they don't like what they are playing, how they are playing, or who they are playing with, they can CHANGE IT!


Upcoming Family Board Game Night and an Introduction to our School Wide Focus on OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning)

If you have not yet completed the online portion of the kindergarten registration which can be accessed at www.tdsb.on.ca/kindergarten please do so at your earliest convenience. Should you require the use of a computer, come to the office.

Once this portion of the registration is completed, you will still need to come in person to complete the process, and you will need two proofs of address, birth certificate or passport, health card, and immunization records. We ask that you do so in the afternoons as Ms. Scott is by herself in the mornings.

For those getting ready to register for French Immersion Kindergarten, your online portion was completed when you initially registered in the fall, and was completed when you accepter. You are still required to complete the in person paper work. Our French immersion Kindergarten registration week is taking place the week of March 4-8.
