For all parents / guardians of grade 3 and 6 students; please note that EQAO will take place from May 21st to June 4th from 8:50 a.m. – 10:10 a.m. We ask that you try to avoid appointments, lateness and absences during these days when possible. September Placement: Parent Input

The process of student placement for the upcoming school year followed at Blake Street Public School is a collaborative one that has input from these sources:

- sending and receiving teachers
- principal and office administrator
- support personnel

During the early weeks of June, several meetings will be devoted to student placement. During these meetings, the best possible educational experience for your child will be given the utmost consideration. Parent information shared throughout the year at parent/teacher conferences will be helpful as the Blake Street teachers discuss the student placement process and consider the following:

- balance of numbers in a class
- Ministry of Education primary class size caps
- ratio of males & females in a class

- balance of students' levels of English Language Proficiency
- balance of academic performance according to Ministry expectations
- consideration of possible negative peer influences
- social, emotional and physical needs of the student

While we try to accommodate parent suggestions, please understand that a great deal of professional time and consideration will be devoted to the student placement decision.

If there is information you feel should be considered by the committee regarding your child's placement, please submit it in writing to the office by **Monday May 20, 2019.** The 2019/2020 school year staff, teachers and their grades are not yet finalized. You will be notified of your child's classroom for 2019-2020 in September. Tentative class lists (first names only) will be posted on the exterior rear doors of the school on Labour Day weekend.

Your information/requests should indicate your child's needs and program preferences, as opposed to names of teachers. <u>No requests for individual teachers will be accommodated</u> for the reasons mentioned above, along with the potential for staffing and class arrangement changes right up until the end of October.

Our tentative (pending the possibility of a fall re-organization) approved staffing model for next year is below. A co-teaching model means that two teachers will share a large space and co-teach together.

English:

FDK FDK FDK (under 16 students with no ECE) Grade 1 and Grade 1 /2 (co-teaching model) Grade 2 /3 Grade 3 /4 Grade 4 am which streamlines into the Grade 4/5 in the pm Grade 5 am co-teaching with the Grade 6 am, which streamlines into either the Grade 4/5 or 5/6 in the pm Grade 6 am which streamlines into the grade 5/6 in the pm

French:

SK FI SK FI Grade 1 Grade 1 / 2 and Grade 1 /2 (co-teaching model) Grade 2/3 and Grade 3 (co-teaching model) Grade 4/5 Grade 4/5

Have you moved? For those of you who have moved out of the Blake Street attendance area over the school year, your child has been permitted to complete their 2019 school year here at Blake. For the 2019/2020 School Year you will need to register your child at his/her home school.

Please help us with our placement meetings and enrolment by letting us know ASAP if your child <u>WILL NOT</u> be returning to Blake Street P.S. in September 2019.
