Caring and Safe Committee Updates

- We wanted to introduce our 2 hall monitors who support the Junior/Intermediate building: Brandon Scatterty and Christopher Stathouses.
- Assemblies related to the new Code of Conduct will be held on **Monday, April 14th 2025** in the morning (Junior and Intermediate classes) and **Tuesday, April 15th 2025** in the morning (Kindergarten and Primary classes).
- Code of Conduct posters will be presented at the assemblies and be visible throughout the school hallways and classrooms in English, French and Anishinaabemowin.
- Curriculum connection of the Code of Conduct will be explored in Health (D strand: Making Healthy Choices), Drama (B strand: Creating and Presenting) & Dance (A strand: Creating and Presenting) and Language (A strand: Digital Media Literacy & B strand: Language Foundations for Reading and Writing -Vocabulary)
- To build capacity among the Grade 6 students, we will be training 20 students with one lead teacher and our school nurse (Sara Pineda) on the PALS (Playground Activity Leaders in Schools). The program is a student-led peer leadership program in elementary school that aims to foster a sense of belonging, inclusion, and physical activity by training students to plan and lead fun and safe activities on the playground during breaks. They will be trained on **Friday April 25th 2025** for the entire morning.
