Principal's Message

Dear Bowmore Families,

This week, we want to focus on school safety and how we address issues of racism and hate speech. Recently, we discovered very offensive and hateful graffiti on one of our exterior walls. At Bowmore, we are committed to creating a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment for all students, and we have already taken steps to address the incident. In April, we also met with our Caring and Safe Schools Committee to further strengthen our efforts in creating a safe and welcoming environment, and we will be meeting frequently to ensure every student feels valued and supported.

We encourage families to have ongoing conversations at home about the importance of kindness, respect, and the impact of our words on others. Additionally, we want to remind students that if they ever witness hate speech or any harmful behaviour, they should always inform an adult and reach out for support. It's important for all of us to work together to ensure that Bowmore remains a place where everyone feels safe and welcome. If students need help, our school social worker and staff are here to support them. Your voice matters, and we encourage you to reach out anytime you have any questions or concerns. We value our partnership with you in making Bowmore a place where every student can be happy and thrive.

For more information about how we handle incidents of hate, racism and discrimination, please refer to PR728 on our website. In short, when an incident occurs, we follow these steps:

- Ensure Safety & Well-being of Students and Staff
- Investigate, Debrief and Document
- Notify TDSB's Caring & Safe Schools Department and the Superintendent
- Inform Police and Allow for Evidence Collection
- Communicate Internally with Various Departments (Human Rights Office, Equity Department, etc)
- Engage the School Community Appropriately
- Collaborate on Education and Prevention (e.g., Combatting Hate and Racism workshop for staff on May 12, and Equity Coaches will be visiting Bowmore on May 13 to work with several staff members)

We hope this message answers some of your questions about this critical issue. Hate has no place at Bowmore, and we look forward to working together with all of you to foster a supportive and inclusive community. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions or concerns. Thank you for your ongoing support.

- Newly Developed Personal Use of Mobile Device in Schools Policy (P106)

On April 22, 2025, the Board approved the newly developed Personal Mobile Device Use in Schools Policy (P106).

The newly developed Personal Mobile Device in Schools Policy (P106) (the "Policy") was developed in accordance with the resolution of the Board of Trustees of January 31, 2024. The Policy outlines requirements for the appropriate use of Personal Mobile Devices by students, staff and other members of the TDSB School Community at schools; advances a conducive learning environment and promote responsible Digital Citizenship; and aims to reduce negative impacts of excessive screen time and social media use on students' achievement, well-being, and mental health.


The Policy also supports implementation of the Ministry of Education's Policy / Program Memorandum No. 128: The Provincial Code of Conduct and School Board Codes of Conduct (PPM No. 128) and is aligned with TDSB's policies and procedures, including but not limited to: the Acceptable Use of Information Technology Resources (P088), the Communications Policy (P104), the Caring and Safe Schools Policy (P051), the Equity Policy (P037), and the Human Rights Policy (P031).
