
It is important that we remember to centre First Nations, Métis, and Inuit perspectives, voices, histories, and contemporary realities across the TDSB every day. This month places emphasis on creating opportunities to learn from Indigenous perspectives on treaties, leadership, achievements, resurgence, futurities, and creativity.

The TDSB is committed to the implementation of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action (TRC) and the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

Below is a list of significant dates throughout the month of November:

- Treaties Recognition Week is the first full week of November, from November 3-9
- November 7 is International Inuit Day
- November 8 is National Indigenous Veterans Day
- November 16 is Louis Riel Day in Ontario

The Urban Indigenous Education Centre will host virtual events to support students and staff to learn from Indigenous Peoples. Resources can be found on the Urban Indigenous Education Centre website.

The Bowmore library is often busy with students reading, playing chess and board games, working at the puzzle table, all while a group of student volunteers (#Shelfies) help with reshelving books. With the funds raised from the book fair, our librarian, Ms Jarvis, will continue to create a safe and welcoming space for students. The total of the book fair proceeds will be used to update the library with new books and also to purchase items such as organization systems and furniture making the library a comfortable and inclusive space for all students.

What is an Extended Day Program?

An Extended Day Program (EDP) provides seamless learning for children from Kindergarten to Grade 6 who require care before school starts and at the end of the school day. Children will develop skills such as collaboration, responsibility, problem-solving, creativity, citizenship and leadership through interesting activities. Extended Day Programs will be delivered by TDSB staff, including a Designated Early Childhood Educator. Children will receive two nutritious snacks per day.

Early French Immersion (JK entry) – November 4th to November 29th, 2024 (4 weeks) – central application process. This deadline will help support the Planning Department in meeting its timelines for local school projections.

For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's Early French Immersion Program, we offer an online process to apply. The entry point to Early French Immersion is Junior Kindergarten. An offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) is guaranteed to all eligible on-time applicants. While every effort is made to place students in the school identified as their area French Immersion school, this is not always possible. Students may be redirected to another school with available program space.

Families with an older sibling currently in an Early French Immersion program at the same school are still required to complete an online application for the new student. For more information, please visit: <u>Application Early French Immersion</u>.

Please find an AODA <u>poster</u> and <u>flyer card</u> with QR Code. We ask that you print and display in prominent and visible area(s) of the school community or share in newsletters/school communications and with community partners (e.g., community centres, faith-based locations, gyms, etc.) where permissible.

At any time, please visit the <u>TDSB French Language Programs webpage</u> to view a <u>video</u> that provides information about the TDSB French Language programs as well as the application and placement process in the Early French Immersion and the Middle French Immersion programs. More information about the Early Immersion Program is available in <u>22 languages</u>, or view the <u>application video</u>.

A few reminders about the process and questions you may be asked at this point:

- The deadline to apply online to the program is November 29, 2024.
- If a parent/caregiver cannot access a computer, please consider accommodating them at a school computer.
- Please let parents/caregivers know the process is NOT handled on a first come, first served basis. All applications received by the deadline are managed with the same priority.
- If parents/caregiver experience difficulties, they may contact us via email at: <u>PARS_FSL_Admin@tdsb.on.ca</u>
- A parent/caregiver may still submit an application online after the deadline passes on November 29, 2024; the application will be marked as late, and the application will be on a waitlist subject to available space until the end of September of the entry year. There is NO guarantee of placement.
- Placements in French Immersion are offered based on current home address of record in PowerSchool, not on location or enrolment in childcare.
 - Please ensure that parent/caregiver/student addresses are up-to-date in PowerSchool.

When the online application system (PARS) opens...

How do I apply to Early French Immersion?

- Please invite parents/caregivers to visit the online application site at: <u>www.tdsb.on.ca/pars</u>.
- They will select the program from a drop-down menu on the right (Early French Immersion) and follow the prompts.
- This process is not first come first served. In the weeks following the close of the application, offers of placement will be sent to the email address provided by the parent/caregiver.
- Please encourage them to check this email frequently and follow the prompts in the message when the offer is made.
- Support documents (<u>Application Process Step-By-Step</u> and <u>Application Process Tip</u> <u>Sheet</u>) have been added to the <u>Application Early French Immersion</u> to help parents/caregivers with the application process.

My child is not in the TDSB and does not have an OEN. <mark>ALL families will be non-TDSB</mark> families who have child(ren) born in 2021.

- For non-TDSB students, the parent/caregiver selects the "Non-TDSB Student" option on the PARS site and follows the steps to generate an identification number.
- They must then continue the application process with this number.
- The following support document (<u>Application Process Step-By-Step</u>) has been added to the <u>Application Early French Immersion</u> to help parents/caregivers with the application process.

I can't get on the website.

- Please reassure the parent/caregiver that the application is not handled on a first come, first served basis.
- If there is an internet issue, the parent/caregiver may try again. If there is a problem with the site, please let us know via email and assure the parent/caregiver that it will be taken care of, and they should try again in the next couple of days.
- If the parent/caregiver cannot access the internet from home or has any other challenges using the online system, please offer them assistance at the school or have them contact our office.
 - With a DOB, anyone can submit the application for the parent/caregiver.

When will I hear?

- Offers of placement will begin in the days following the application deadline and they will continue for the weeks following. Not all families in a given area will receive their offers of placement at the same time, but all will receive one.
- Please encourage the parent/caregiver to check their email frequently (including their junk mail). Please do not offer a firm date when the offers of placement should be completed.

Is it a first come first served process?

- No. All applications received by the deadline are treated with the same priority and are guaranteed a place in the program (we cannot guarantee placement in a given school).
- All applications received after the deadline will be held on a waitlist and considered subject to available space until the end of September of the entry year.

Are we able to select a particular school or location for my child to attend Early French Immersion?

• Placement in French Immersion via the central application process is based on current home address of record in PowerSchool.

- An offer of placement will be made based on the child's current home address of record in PowerSchool prior to the application deadline.
- If the address changes between the application deadline and the fall of the entry year, there is no guarantee of placement in the new area.

The online application for admission for September 2025 will be open from Monday, January 6, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. to Friday, January 31, 2025 at 4:00 p.m.

The City is seeking input from all Toronto residents, particularly families, for their input on priorities for the coming years. Past consultations had resulted in the creation of new community recreation hubs (with schools, libraries, and childcare centres within) in several neighbourhoods in the city. The City is encouraging residents to participate in an online survey and/or one of the public consultations happening in each ward in November.
