
#### **Healthy Food**




#### DRESS FOR THE WEATHER

## The Importance of Good Hand Washing





During the summer, drive your child to see the <u>front of the school</u> and the <u>Kindergarten entrance area</u> (side of the school).

By getting your child used to the school setting you are beginning to support this transition in September. Letting your child also play on the <u>school field</u> or watching them play on our <u>adventure playground</u> will also help them become more familiar with the school. **Talk about school using positive language**.

model the value of reading and writing - in your HOME language





 share experiences - talk about what you or your child sees, thinks, and wonders



read environmental print in order to build early literacy skills







## Maximizing language-learning experiences before Kindergarten

- label and describe objects and actions
- take turns in conversation and play
- provide your child with opportunities to communicate
- Speaking your home language is very important and will **not** prevent your child from learning English.





#### Come Learn With Us!

Starting school is an exciting time. Our schools provide a rich learning environment for all children to learn and grow.

In the Kindergarten program, your child will develop their skills and abilities through inquiry and intentional play-based learning that includes math, science and literacy. Teachers and early childhood educators plan learning experiences where children are actively engaged in learning and thinking creatively.

Children who will be four by December 31, 2023, can start Junior Kindergarten in September 2023.

#### How to Register for Kindergarten

Registration for **English** Kindergarten programs begins in February. We look forward to welcoming you and your child!

- Only parents or legal guardians can register a child.
- There is a separate process to apply for <u>out-of-area</u> <u>admissions</u>. Please contact <u>alternative schools</u> or <u>elementary</u> <u>academies</u> directly for more information.
- If your child currently attends child care at a TDSB school that is not your designated home school, and you wish to register for Kindergarten at that school, an out-of-area admissions

application may not be required Please review the Out of Area
