Summary of three major council fundraisers 2018/2019:

- Move-a-Thon
- Silent Auction
- Spring Fling Pop-up Market

Discussion to connect fundraising with school priorities. Example: Rooftop garden fundraiser paired with the Fresh from the Farm program (work with farmers directly in the fall, and receive veggies at harvest). Website: https://freshfromthefarm.ca/

How many events should we have per year? Consensus: 3 to 4 events per year (not including small fundraisers like bake sales, etc). Also discussed: Fundraisers not just about raising money; they should also be community-building.

- Continue with Move-a-thon.
  - Try to leverage School Cash Online so there are not so many envelopes of money (but make them available also).

## Discussion of the winter concert and the Brock Silent Auction:

- In the past, these two events have been linked, but this year the concert will be spread out over two days (kindergarteners on Friday morning).
- Other parents (in the past) have found the auction hard to navigate at the concert (busy, rush, trying to get seats).
- This year, Silent Auction will also be available online. Longer bidding period, allow parents to donate online, and raise the profile of local businesses (with links to their websites).
- Will also create a space to bid in person.
  - Possibility of display case on the third floor
  - Presentation during concert (parents on stage with baskets)

Brock made \$13000 from donations and Indigo donation-matching partnership. **Student/Parent census:** Emotional anxiety was revealed as a priority concern among students at Brock. • In response, Brock is introducing a daily meditation for 5-7 minutes. • Council suggests Toronto Centre for Mindfulness or SickKids could potentially help guide staff with this initiative. Also introducing a Well-Being Day to allow "kids to be kids" one day a month. Focus on play and relaxation. **Student Achievement focus is math:** How can we build math fluency with our kids. Don't teach math lessons in isolation, build continuity. **Equity:** How do we have conversations to support our under-served students? Identify our own biases? On Wednesday (Nov. 7), teachers attending a full-day workshop. A learning coach will help build lesson plans around equity. Teachers will return for a group meeting to discuss results of equity-based lesson plan. **Equity and Well-Being Committee:** Ms. Moreiro has invited all kids to enjoy the G.L.O.W. #### **International Languages Update:**

#### By the numbers:

1/3 of Brock parent replied to the survey (97 parents)

52 out of the 97 said not satisfied with the International Languages program at Brock

21 said somewhat satisfied with the International Languages program at Brock

12 said satisfied with the International Languages program at Brock

4 said very satisfied with the International Languages program at Brock

71 parents left comments

Overall, parents want more involvement and information on what's being taught. Improved curriculum and better classroom experiences for theirs kids. Parents feel their kids have been attending language classes (in some cases for years) and have a very limited grasp of the language (counting to ten, a handful of words, etc).

Staff in Int. Languages committed to the following:

- A newsletter is going to be created to share more information.
- Making student work more visible. New bulletin board to display work on the second floor

#### Council responds:

- Re: bulletin board. Parents not typically allowed on the second floor
- Concern kids are not enjoying learning languages and/or about other cultures
- Classroom management is better this year
- Evaluation for language and teaching competency necessary (of students and teachers)

**Discussion:** Very few schools have international languages during the day. Most have after school. Could it be moved to after-school instead of during the day? Should we involve the school trustee?

Yasmin, Cecile and Jessica to speak with School Trustee (or best person) to improve International Languages program.
