- Challenges of the program include the status of Int. Language instructors in a different union and department – principals administer the program, but don't hire, supervise, etc.
- Instructors are not certified teachers, and don't have the same level of classroom management skills with large groups of students at different levels.
- Int. Languages is not a stimulating experience for students – they do worksheets, draw, etc., and have a negative experience of learning languages that can impact on their experience learning French.
- Safety issue with large classes with only one instructor – Yasmin reiterated that she makes rounds regularly, and students are safe
- Stephanie is keen to work towards an Option A/Option B solution for the next school year
- Option A not have the integrated model, and offer the program after school or on weekends
- Option B continue the integrated language but move to one language so there are just one/two languages to allow the instructors to develop a rapport with students and integrate into the school community (Pauline PS did this recently and saw improvement)
- Overheating schools are required to have cooling centres (the Library is a cooling
