We are trying to find ways to help the United Nations fulfill their Sustainable Development Goal (SDG #2) of zero hunger. This project is being done in collaboration with Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) as part of their goIT programme, run by a former Brookside teacher, Ms. Bahri.

The students showed a great deal of empathy when developing solutions to help figure out a way to provide food for those in need. They came up with the idea of building a community food box where donations could be kept and families who need food could visit. We are also working on developing an app so that donations can be tracked and you can indicate when a food item has been removed from the box.
