- ◆ Bananas are curved because they grow towards the sun.



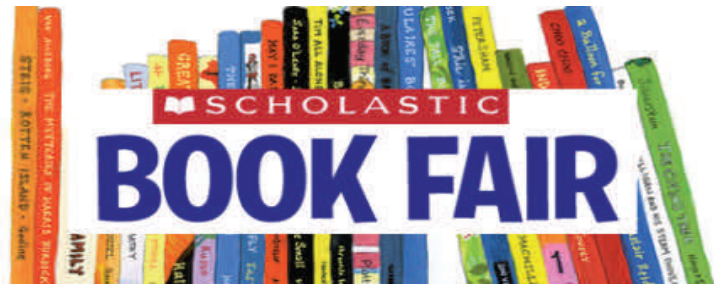
- ◆ 77% of the world's maple syrup is made in Quebec.

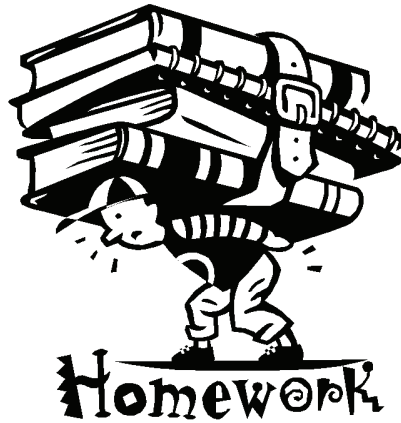
