1. Introduction (Micah Rodrigues and George Baiden)

- Approval of October 2, 2019 meeting minutes
 - Minutes approved

2. Chair report (Micah Rodrigues and George Baiden)

• Castlebar School Council by-laws

- Drafted by-laws are a revised version of the Norseman Junior Middle School council by-laws
- Discussion about length of terms for executive council positions; procedural recommendation that if an executive member knows they will not be present or available in the following school year, that they let the council know; suggestion to have vice-Treasurer role, so that there can be a transition period
- Email and proxy voting discussion: change to draft that no voting by proxy
 permitted (but there will be some allowances for emergencies on a caseby-case basis); members are allowed two email votes per year, but they
 cannot happen consecutively
- Voting on draft by-laws: draft by-laws, with change noted above (for email and proxy voting), approved by members present (waiting on votes from three absent members who have until Monday November 11 to vote via email)

Lice check options

- Nitwits has moved out of Etobicoke which makes it difficult to take advantage of their follow-up appts for affected families; no other local lice check clinics have responded at the time of the meeting
- Voting on lice check option: motion approved to keep previously scheduled appointment with Nitwits for January 10th (\$1.15/head)

3. Principal's report (Ms. Bellehumeur)

• Construction update:

- Library: radiators and shelving are currently being installed (shelving scheduled for Nov 7); windows are installed, door to come; book collection to be delivered Nov 14th, TDSB team coming to set up collection Nov 20-21; library scheduled to be open Nov 25th
- Classrooms: windows are being installed; installation should be complete Nov 25th
- Front door, universal washroom, boiler room: continued renovations but students should not be affected

• Curriculum:

 Parent reading strategies presentation: two sessions were already offered in October (for grade 1 and 2 parents and SK), one more session to happen Nov 7 (5:30-6:30pm) for SK; babysitting is available; two more sessions to

- come in January for JK students (prior to take-home reading program being sent home)
- Science: Life Systems (grade 1: living things; grade 2: animals; grade 3: plants)
- **Social Studies**: Citizenship and Heritage (grade 1: rules and responsibilities; grade 2: heritage and celebrations; grade 3: plants
- Math: Number Sense and Numeration and Patterning
- **Music**: tempo, pitch, voice quality; singing happens at the character trait assemblies, and there is a Castlebar song!
- Language Arts: Reading, writing, oral communication; books have been sent home that are at each student's reading level; in grade 2/3, if students are reading above the reading level available in the home reading program, then they can select their own novel/book for reading
- Additional staff allocation: Mr. Hwang, .5 ESL teacher; excellent addition, he is working closely with Ms. Kim to support students with language (reading, writing, oral communication)
- **Student recognition assembly**: last Friday of each month, run by Mr. McGinn; this month's character trait is empathy
- Upcoming dates:
 - Nov 11: Remembrance Day Assembly (parents welcome, arrive by 10:40am)
 - Nov 11-15: Scholastic book fair (open to parents 3:30-4:45pm each day, and on evening of parent interviews until 7:30pm, and on morning of interviews from 8:45am); portion of sales is given back to Castlebar library) **watch for announcement about possible teacher wish lists for parents who wish to buy something for classrooms from the fair
 - Nov 12: Reports go home
 - **Nov 13**: Pizza lunch
 - Nov 14: parent teacher interviews (after school and evening)
 - Nov 15: PA day (parent teacher interviews)
 - Nov 27: Pizza lunch

- Discussion about cost of childminding for School Council Meetings; if there
 are more than 12 children, additional staff required for childminding; parents
 will be requested to let Council know if they require childminding each
 meeting so proper arrangements can be made
 - Voting on: motion to raise childminding allocation to \$500 (from initial \$200 allocation), and revisit once \$400 has been spent, approved
- Teachers to provide wish list and pricing of wish list for classroom items;
 possible that Council will vote via email if wish lists are received in time to
 purchase items before winter holidays
