CEDARBRAE COLLEGIATE INSTITUTE COURSE SELECTION FOR 2024-2025 For Students Moving from Grade 9 to Grade 10

Students moving from Grade 9 to Grade 10 must choose a <u>total of 8 courses and 3 alternatives</u>: Regular Program – include <u>5</u> compulsory courses plus <u>3</u> elective courses and <u>3</u> alternative courses. Immersion and Extended students – include <u>6</u> compulsory courses plus <u>2</u> elective courses and <u>3</u> alternative courses.

When choosing the codes for your compulsory courses keep in mind that the **5th and bolded** letter in each of the codes listed above indicates the **level** at which the course is offered: **D**- Academic, **O**- Open. Many of the Grade 10 elective courses are offered at the open level and do not require a prerequisite. Make sure you have the prerequisite for the courses you are choosing. If a student fails a grade 9 core course (English, Math, Science, Geography, French) than they need to put this into their timetable for next year. If they want to complete the course before September they can sign up for summer school and when the student has passed summer school their timetable for next year will be changed (i.e. put in the appropriate grade 10 course) The remaining elective courses and alternative courses should be made with the following in mind:

- Other diploma requirements (check your Student Status Sheet). Check to see if there are any other compulsory courses you are missing; for example, group 1, or group 2 or group 3.
- Check that you have the prerequisites for the courses you are interested in.
- Your interests, your skills, and your career ideas.

*A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth compulsory English credit must be a Grade 12 English course. ** In Groups 1, 2, and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from Group 1 and one from <u>either</u> group 2 <u>or</u> group 3. ***A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits. +The 12 optional credits may include up to four credits earned through approved dual credit courses.
