- March 9 - deadline for courses to be approved in myblueprint
- March 10 data transfer from myblueprint to power school

What does a grade 9 student choose?

When selecting courses for grade 10 a student will choose a total of 8 credits:

- 1 English
- 1 Math
- 1 Science
- 1 History
- 0.5 Civics
- 0.5 Careers
- 3 Elective credits

Electives can be: any grade 10 Visual Art, Music, Drama, Physed, or Tech

What does a Grade 10 student choose?

When selecting courses for grade 11 a student will choose a total of 8 courses:

- Grade 11 English
- Grade 11 Math

The remaining 6 credits can be made up of packages, or SHSM's, and any remaining group, compulsory and elective credits.

What does a Grade 11 student choose?

When selecting courses for grade 12 a student will choose a minimum 6 courses:

- Grade 12 English
- If they are currently registered in a grade 11 package or SHSM
- Then they will choose the corresponding grade 12 package or SHSM
- Any remaining compulsory/mandatory credit
- Any remaining elective credits
- Courses they require for programs in University or College
- Any other outstanding SHSM course requirements

What you need to graduate

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) Requirements

COMPULSORY CREDITS
Students *must* earn the following **18 compulsory credits** to get their Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in mathematics (at least 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in science
- 1 credit in Canadian history (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian geography (Grade 9)
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics and citizenship
- 3 credits for group 1, 2 and 3 courses (1 credit in each group)*

*of the 18 compulsory credits, students must complete 1 from each of the following groups:

GROUP 1

- English (including the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course) or French as a second language
- Native languages
- First Nations, Métis, and Inuit studies
- classical and international languages
- social sciences and the humanities
- Canadian and world studies
- guidance and career education
- cooperative education
- American Sign Language as a second language
- Langue des signes québécoise langue seconde

GROUP 2

- health and physical education
- the arts
- business studies
- French as a second language
- cooperative education
- American Sign Language as a second language
- Langue des signes québécoise langue seconde

GROUP 3

- science (Grade 11 or 12)
- technological education
- French as a second language
- computer studies
- cooperative education
- American Sign Language as a second language
- Langue des signes québécoise langue seconde

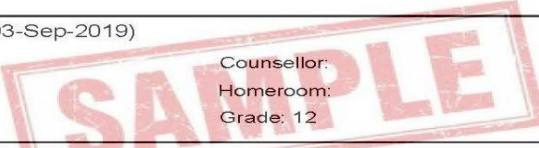

What is an SHSM?

Specialist High Skills Majors (SHSM) are Ministry-approved programs tied to employment sectors. Every SHSM program includes the following five components.

- A package of eight to ten required credits earned in Grade 11 or 12 that support a pathway to apprenticeship training, college, university, or the workplace.
- Certifications and training, which are identified in each SHSM sector (e.g. business, construction, hospitality & tourism, etc.)
- Experiential learning through job shadowing, job twinning, work experience, and career exploration activities.
- Sector-partnered experiences in which students engage with a sector partner to explore sector-related content, skills, and knowledge involving either ICE (innovation, creativity, and entrepreneurship), coding, or mathematical literacy.
- “Reach ahead” opportunities, which allow students to experience learning in their intended postsecondary destination.
