
Grade 12 Course Selection

Before we begin this presentation it is important to know that if you are graduating this year and/or planning on not returning you are still required to complete a plan in myblueprint.

For those not returning, enter the appropriate destination code:

If you wish to return for a 5th year:

Scenario 1

** If a student is in a graduating position by the end of June or a few credits short and wishes to return next year, they <u>must</u> speak to their vice principal to obtain approval.

Scenario 2

If a student is in their fourth year of high school and will have earned less than 24 credits by the end of June, they must speak to their vice principal to obtain permission to return next year.

 Pass the Literacy Test (OSSLT) or pass the Literacy Course (OLC4O1 - This course is an option if you were unsuccessful on the test)

What do you need to graduate from high school?

18 compulsory credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

- credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
- credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- credits in science
- credit in Canadian history
- credit in Canadian geography
- credit in the arts
- credit in health and physical education
- credit in French as a second language
- credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics

- 12 optional credits1
- 40 hours of community involvement
- the provincial literacy requirement

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:

Group 1:

- . English or French as a second language**
- a Native language
- · a classical or international language
- social sciences and the humanities.
- Canadian and world studies
- guidance and career education
- · cooperative education***

Group 2:

- health and physical education.
- · the arts
- · business studies
- French as a second language**
- cooperative education***

Group 3:

- · science (Grade 11 or 12)
- technological education
- French as a second language**
- · computer studies
- cooperative education***

¹ The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.






^{*} A maximum of 5 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

^{**} In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

^{***} A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

The Ontario Student Status Sheet

- A document that records all attempted credit
- Categorizes your courses into compulsory and elective categories
- Indicates current courses
- indicates future courses




